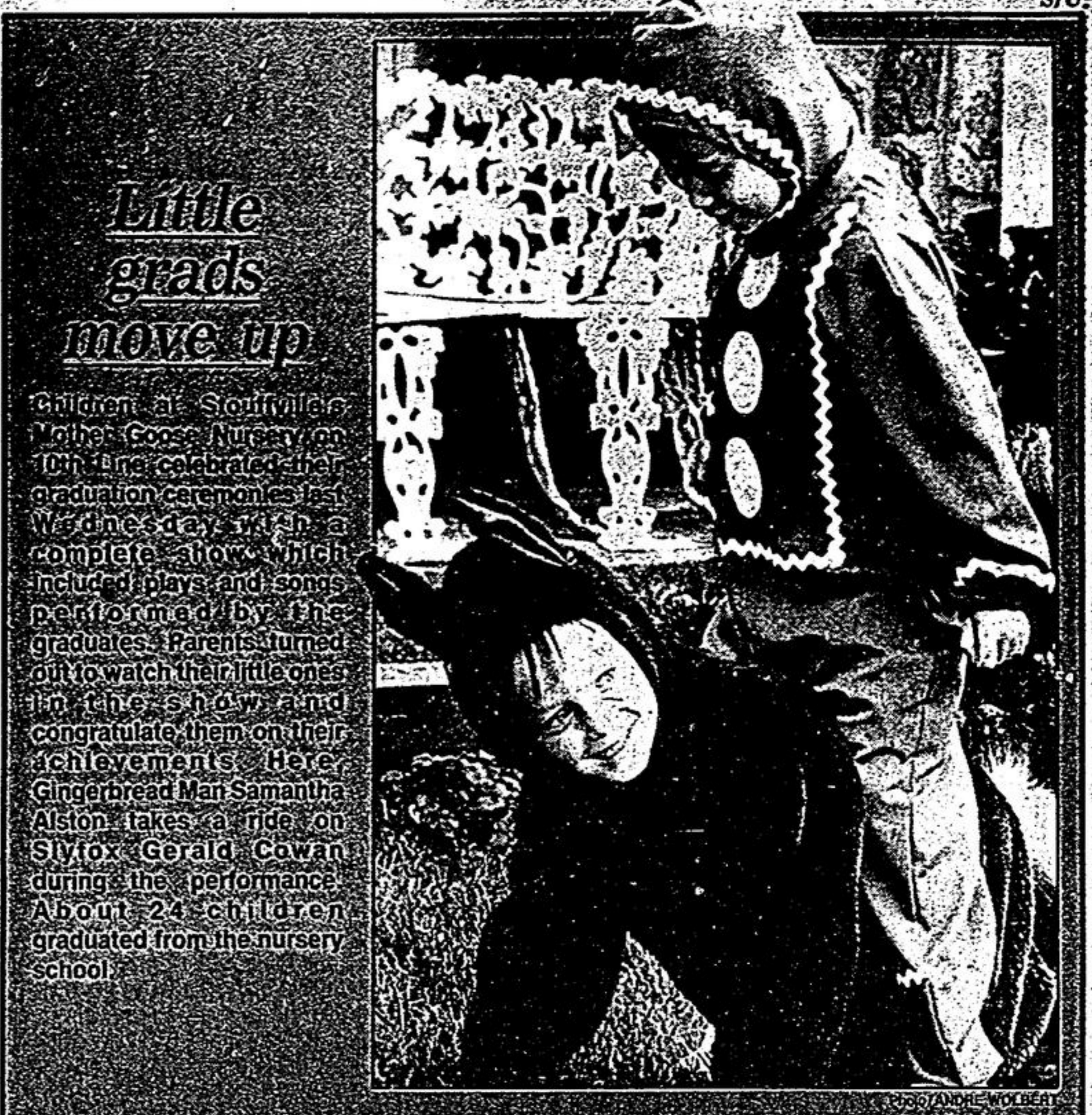

# Farm loan rates on a downswing

Farm Credit Corp. announced June 9 it will lower interest rates on all its loan products.

The reduction is the third since mid-May and is principally due to reduced funding costs.

The rate on loans with terms fixed for 10 and 15 years or more falls half a point to 12.25 per cent. The rate on loans with fixed five-year terms decreases by a quarter point to 12.50 per cent.

Shared Risk Mortgages go down a quarter of a point to 13 per cent. This type of loan permits the borrower to share equally with the Corporation the benefits and costs related to fluctuating interest rates.

Farm syndicate loans also fall a quarter point from 12.75 to 12.50 per cent. This type of loan is used for the joint purchase of machinery and buildings.

As of June 9 the following interest rates apply:

- Shared Risk Mortgage — 13 per cent
- Five-year fixed term — 12.5 per cent
- 10-year fixed term — 12.25 per cent
- 15-year fixed term — 12.25 per cent
- Farm Syndicate Loans — 12 per cent
