Uxbridge petition in 1939 signed to stop bootlegging

Here again are some items of interest called up from issues of *The Tribune* of years gone by — 100 years ago

June 28, 1889: AMUSEMENTS
 This week has seen at least three of the smallest audiences that ever assembled to "take in" a public entertainment. On Monday evening John R. Clarke lectured to an audience of about 40 and on Tuesday evening the attendance was so small that Mr. Clarke declined to proceed. It was thought that the coming of Baird's Dramatic Co. on Wednesday and Thursday evenings was the cause of the slim attendance, but some other cause must be assigned as the crowd on Wednesday night was equally small and went the same way.

It seems that folks have not recovered from Uncle Tom's Cabin and although the Bootblack Orator has lost none of his powers or popularity, folks are not in a mood to patronize any sort of entertainment at present.

50 years ago
 July 6, 1939: In what they say is an attempt to "drive the bootleggers out of Uxbridge," 300 citizens have signed a petition there asking that local authority to sell beer be established.

The petition will be presented to Town Council with a request that a plebiscite be held as soon as possible.

Supporters of the petition say the signatures secured represent a complete cross-section of Uxbridge, including 90 per cent of the businessmen and even clergymen.

They maintain that the move is one for temperance rather than the beginning of a "wet" party in long-dry Uxbridge and has been started solely because of the activity of bootleggers.

25 years ago
 June 25, 1964: Although this area escaped the full force of a wind and rain storm that lashed many points of southern Ontario on Tuesday evening, there was some interruption of hydro and telephone service in the district. South of Mongolia, the 10th con. of Markham was blocked for a

time when two trees were toppled across the road. A similar blockade occurred on 18th Ave. Markham at con. 5 and east of Victoria Square. Power was cut off in a portion of Unionville, also on the 4th con. of Pickering.

10 years ago
 June 28, 1979: STOUFFVILLE — The finest country music show ever staged here (or in any community this size), attracted an estimated 3,000 people to the Stouffville Arena Sunday, and proved a fitting tribute to the talents of the late Ed Wideman.

The dazzling array of top stars included such professionals as Ronnie Prophet, Ian and Sylvia, Dave and Sugar, and the Good Brothers, all close friends of the deceased.

Ed Wideman of Dickson's Hill and later, Richmond Hill, died in a single-car accident Feb. 27 on the Stouffville-Gormley Road.
