The Originals Bands with a message

Their "original" music inspires, and their musical message goes beyond the tunes of other bands to include an extra dimension — social conscience.

"We're The Originals," says Bobby Crane, bass guitarist for the Markham-based rock band. "There aren't too many bands the same or similar to ours."

The five-member group plays mainly original music written by lead vocalist Mike Stanfield, and collaborated by the rest of the band.

Crane describes their music as "modern folk rock" and all their songs have a meaning.

"Almost all our songs have a deeper meaning; we don't sing about nothing. Mike's music and lyrics have morals, he's really socially conscious and he plays on that," says Crane.

In Stanfield's "message" songs, a recurring theme that appears is one of searching for each person's role in society.

Crane says that although Stanfield writes most of the lyrics, the entire band comes together in developing the music.

"We're really in touch with each other and complement each other's talents," he says.

Band members are: Mike Spriggs, lead guitar and back-up vocals; Robbie Desimone, drummer; Mike Stanfield, lead vocals and rhythm guitar; and Bobby Crane, bass guitar and back-up vocals.

The band in its entirety has

been together for about three years and has played at several clubs including: The Diamond, El Mocombo, Greens in Markham, and the Markham Talent Night.

The band recently played at the Strawberry Festival over

the holiday weekend in Stouffville, where it was a runner-up in a talent competition.

The Originals is a band that captures the interest and inspires its listeners. Its music is rhythmic and melodious.

The music of The Originals is

not meant to merely entertain, but to arouse a social conscience and awareness in their audiences that did not exist before.

"We don't compare ourselves to other artists or music — we are The Originals," says Crane.
