1st Instalment due — August 18th, 1989
2nd Instalment due — October 20th, 1989
FINAL: Tax bills have now been mailed. Rate payers who have not received their bills should make immediate application to the Municipal Tax Department.
The PENALTY charged for non payment of 1989 taxes is one and one-quarter (1 1/4) percent imposed on the first day of default and on the first day of each month thereafter.
Failure to receive a tax bill does not eliminate the responsibility for payment of taxes nor the penalty charge for late payment.

NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF A ZONING BY-LAW BY THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE
TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville passed By-law 89-101 on the 28th day of June, 1989 under Section 34 of the Planning Act, 1983.
AND TAKE NOTICE that any person or agency may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the by-law by filing with the Clerk of The Corporation of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville not later than the 2ND day of AUGUST, 1989 a notice of appeal setting out the objection to the by-law and the reasons in support of the objection.
An explanation of the purpose and effect of the by-law, describing the lands to which the by-law applies, is below. As the By-law applies to all lands which are zoned General Commercial (GC) or Local Commercial (LC) in General Zoning By-law No. 87-34, and not serviced with municipal sanitary sewers no key map is provided. The complete by-law is available for inspection in my office during regular office hours.

EXPLANATORY NOTE
BY-LAW NUMBER 89-101
The proposed Amendment applies to all lands which are:
1. Zoned General Commercial (GC) or Local Commercial (LC) in General Zoning By-law No. 87-34; and
2. Not serviced with municipal sanitary sewers.
The Amendment zones the General Commercial (GC) and Local Commercial (LC) Zone requirements by reducing the number of dwelling units permitted above commercial uses to one (1) dwelling unit for each commercial store/unit.
This restriction to one (1) dwelling unit per commercial store/unit will not apply to lands which are serviced with municipal sanitary sewers. General Zoning By-law No. 87-34 presently permits two (2) dwelling units per commercial store/unit in any General Commercial (GC) or Local Commercial (LC) Zone regardless of the method of servicing.
