## Force still battles fatal accident stats

In a recent article about our police force's fatal traffic accident concerns, it was noted that over the past two years York Region has seen 25 fatal car accidents in 1987 and 35 in 1988.

To date (July, 1989) we have had only 13 fatal car accidents, which I thought was great, until I spoke with Chief Donald Hillock about these low statistics.

His comment was that 13 fatal car accidents was not good. In fact, he was still quite troubled about having even 13 to date.

He went on to say that when we have no fatal accidents in a year he would be happy.

Chief Hillock would like to remind all residents of York Region that it is one of his mandates to stop fatal accidents through traffic enforcement and public education.

1st Instalment due August 18th, 1989  
2nd Instalment due October 20th, 1989

FINAL Tax bills have now been mailed. Rate payors who have not received their bills should make immediate application to the Municipal Tax Department.

The PENALTY charged for non-payment of 1989 taxes is one and one-quarter (1¼) percent imposed on the first day of default and on the first day of each month thereafter.

Failure to receive a tax bill does not eliminate the responsibility for payment of taxes nor the penalty charge for late payment.

IF YOU HAVE JUST PURCHASED A NEWLY CONSTRUCTED HOUSE, PLEASE MAKE CERTAIN THAT THE BUILDER (PREVIOUS OWNER) HAS PAID THEIR PROPER SHARE OF VACANT LAND TAXES ON YOUR STATEMENT OF ADJUSTMENTS PREPARED BY YOUR SOLICITOR ON PURCHASE.
