

Foreign firefighter compares notes

To most Stouffville residents, the fire station on Main St. is just another town building.

But to 37-year-old Francesco Paolo Colicchio, the local fire hall is a shrine of invaluable information and wonder.

Mr. Colicchio is the Chief Fire Commander in Rome, Italy, and was in Stouffville last week to visit his uncle.

And one of the first things the trim, dark-haired visitor wanted to do was see how a small-town volunteer fire department operates.

"He was very impressed with what he saw," Mr. Colicchio's uncle Joe Colicchio said in an interview last week. "He thought Fire Chief Bill Brown ran a sound department."

Mr. Colicchio, who has trouble speaking English, told his uncle that Stouffville's firefighting operation "is a bit behind Rome's in some areas."

But he added that, given the contrasting sizes of two centres, such disparities could be expected.

Rome is a city of some 6,000,000 people and there are 11 fire stations throughout the city, Mr. Colicchio said. But there are also 15,000 volunteer fire departments similar to Stouffville's across Italy.

"Overall, he felt operations here were excellent," Joe said. "He really likes Stouffville and he would like to move here in the future."

At 37, Mr. Colicchio is one of the youngest Commanders of Fire Operations in Rome's history.

Introduced to the trade by his father and grandfather, who were both firefighters, Mr. Colicchio has spent the last 18 years fighting fires.

And he takes pride in the fact that he's working hard to keep

one of Italy's most famous cities beautiful.

"He works very hard," Joe Colicchio said. "There are over 6,000,000 people in Rome and each of the city's 11 fire departments receives over 200 calls per day. And that doesn't even include the outlying areas."

"He's had to deal with fires, three earthquakes and other disasters. It's a big job and he

does it well," Joe said.

But "Paul's" (as he's called by his family) main problem is he doesn't seem to have a lot of time to spend with his family.

"He's on call all the time and he has to leave home often," Joe added. "And that can be tough."

But despite the long hours, Mr. Colicchio said he will continue to work as a firefighter in the future.
