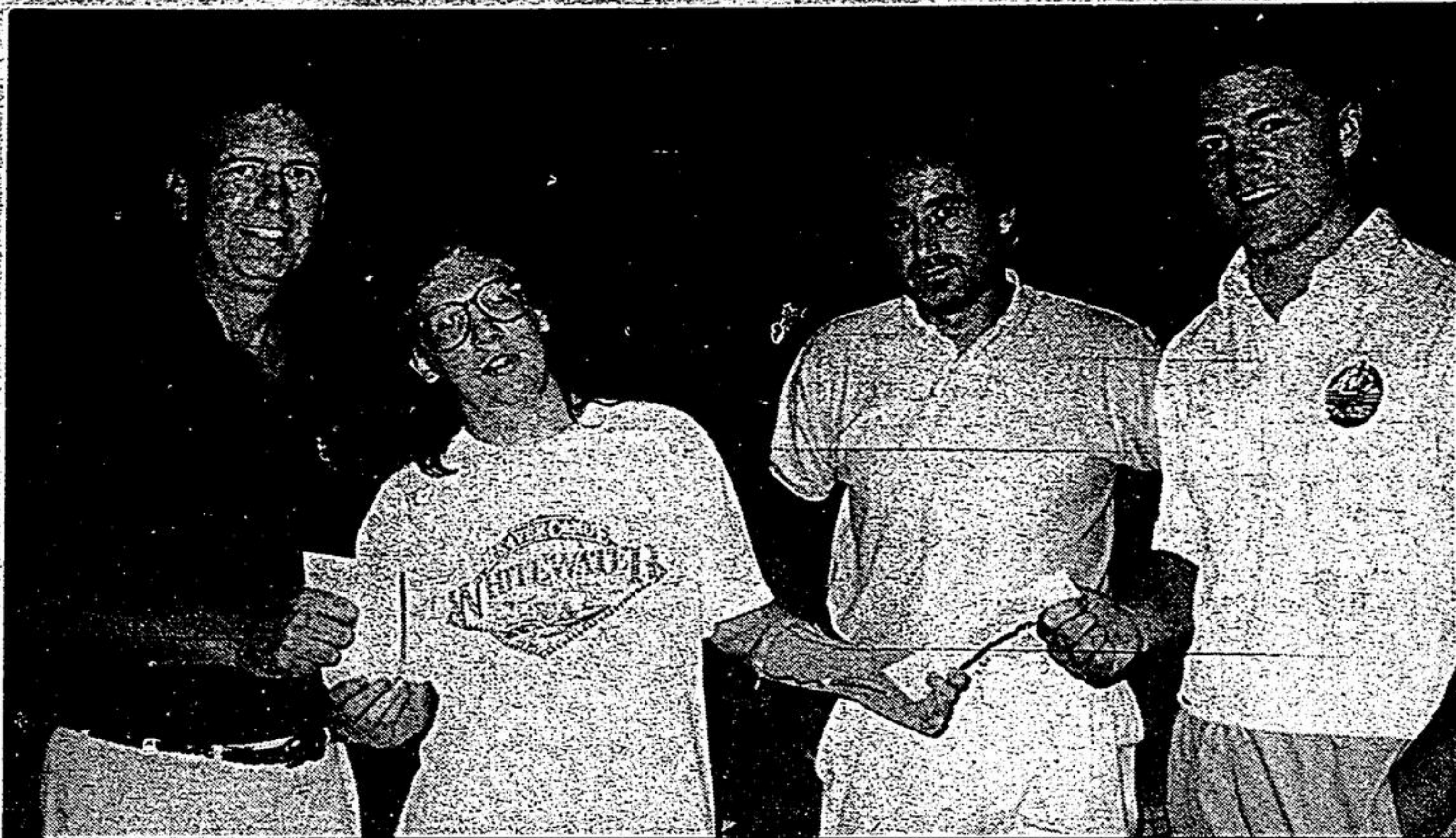

**Golfers tee off for Shane**

More than 60 golfers swung into action Aug. 22 at Firefighters Rolling Hills Golf Club and raised about \$4,500 for a Stouffville teenager, who suffered burns to 35 per cent of his body last June at work when his clothes caught fire.

The money will assist Shane Stapley, 14, in covering minor expenses related to his recovery that could take more than one year to complete, said Bruce Stapley, the youth's father.

Although the teen was insured by his employer under the Workmen's Compensation Board, the payments only cover a student wage for 16 hours a week,

Stapley added.

The 14-year-old was burned while on-the-job at a gas station in the east end of Stouffville.

A co-worker threw a cigarette on the ground and Stapley, who had just been previously doused with gasoline when a nozzle broke, attempted to put the lit cigarette out properly when his clothes went up in flames.

The teen's father said the boy who threw the cigarette on the ground will appear in court September 1990 to face charges because of the incident but Stapley said he wants any charges dropped because "it was an accident."

"I don't know where the police got that story about the other boy

throwing matches at Shane. It was an accident," he added.

Stapley, a freelance writer for the Stouffville Tribune, said his son has "a good attitude towards it", but doesn't always sleep well.

The teen spent eight weeks in the Toronto Hospital for Sick Children where he braved four skin graft operations to repair burns to both legs and his left arm.

Because the healing process is a slow one, the teen must wear a pressure garment almost "like a pair of panty hose," his father said.

The garment is made to fit tight to "keep the skin from granulating", or coming apart even though the wounds are closed up.

"He (Shane) says it feels like 20 mosquito bites all itching at once," and this keeps him up at night.

The teen's father added "it was amazing" the Firefighters golf club in Gormley donated the course because "this is never done."

The monies raised will help his son and Shane's mother Valerie meet expenses that continue to build up and will pay for the garment he must wear for the next year.

Organized by family friends John Heaton, Dave Wood, Wayne Simpson and Jean Peters, the tourney raised enough money for the recovering teenage to think about investing in a computer to help with homework.
