Denise Toole led the Stingers' attack Thursday with a pair of home runs and two singles.

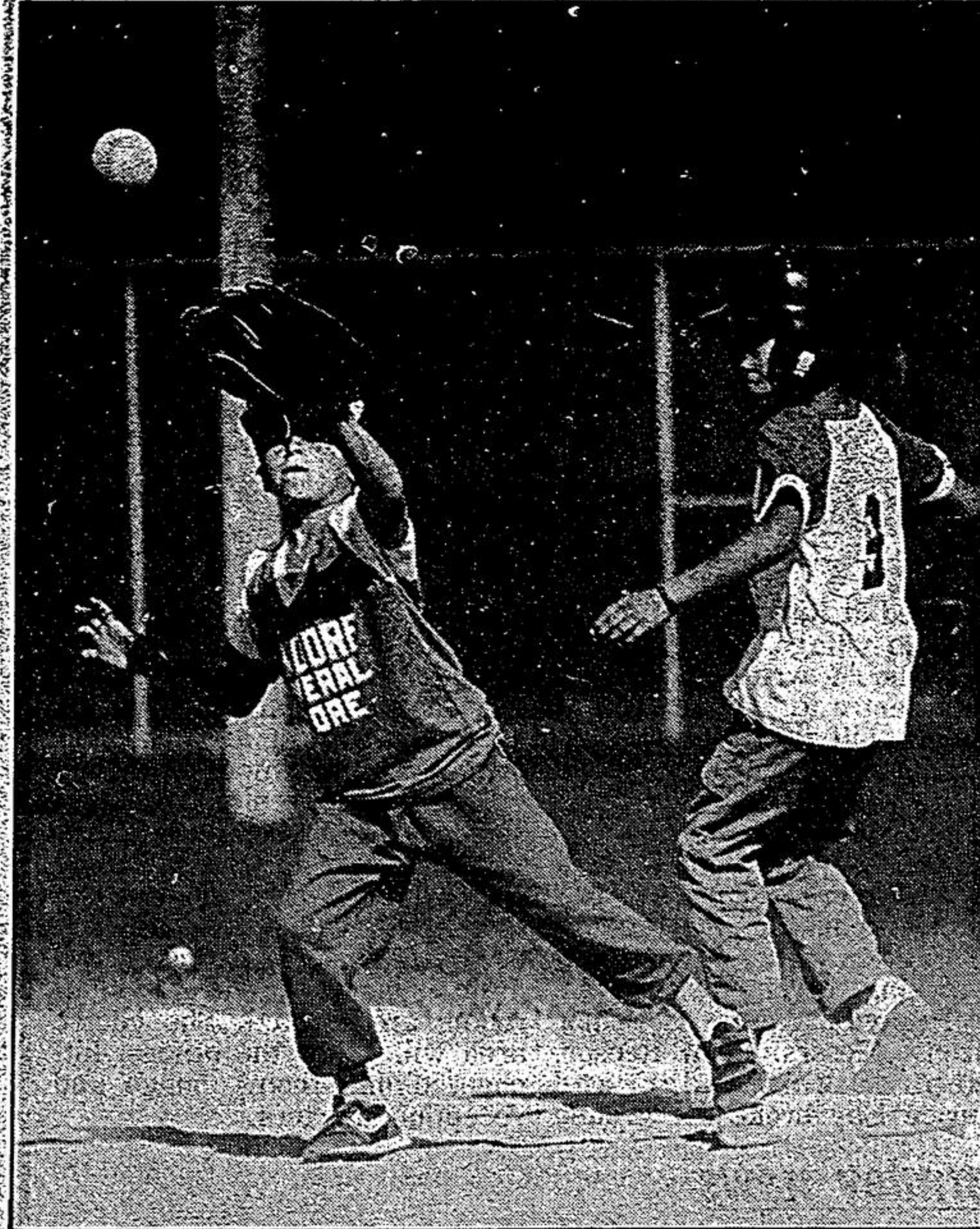
Allison Lowery smacked a homer and three singles, while Debbie Gold had three safeties for the Stingers.
