Grimsby saves little something for much later

Grimsby defeated Toronto Sammy's 1-0 in a 14-inning marathon Sunday at the Town Park to win the Ontario Intermediate Senior B fastball championship.

Stouffville's Betz Pools team, who hosted the two-day tournament which included five top-rated squads, were ousted when they lost two of three games played.

But Betz's Chris Jones took the award for best batting average during the competition. The agile shortstop went four for four, with a double and a triple, scored three runs and had four runs batted in in Betz's only win, a 14-2 thrashing of Scarborough.

Betz lost their opener 2-1 to Grimsby. After beating Scarborough, the Pools Platoon were edged 2-1 by Sammy's to put them out of the running.

Mark Joslin, Jones and John Annis were the Betz recipients of Seagram's Cooler MVP Awards for games in which Betz competed.

Overall tourney MVP was Grimsby pitcher Chris Wilson, who pitched the extra-inning title game shutout against Sammy's.

Sammy's hurler Grant MacIntyre was named the tourney's top pitcher.

The event was well run and attended, according to Betz team officials, with the Stouffville Oldtimer Clippers hockey team heading up food and refreshment stands while also tending to diamond lining and maintenance.

Betz went down to defeat 4-2 to Bracebridge Friday night in the final of the CNE Bulova Watch Tournament. The Stouffville Club ended up with a 3-2 won-loss record with all three wins by shutouts.

Bruins lean, but mean

After a lighter than expected turnout at a special tryout camp held August 26-27, the Uxbridge Bruins are looking to see more hopefuls on the ice as they begin training in earnest this week.

The Junior C Bruins will have from 10-12 returnees from the squad that finished so strong last season. Head coach Hal Murphy says that while he was a little disappointed with the late August showing, he feels the team is still further ahead of where they were at this time last year.

"We would have liked to have seen more local people at the tryouts, but then we didn't send invitations to the local players. But last year, we only had five or

six players from the year before, so we're twice as well off this year."

Murphy claims his defence will need the most attention, as Stuart Holter and Chris Taylor are the only two returnees from the 1988-89 unit.

On the forward lines, the holdovers will include Greg Cook, John Long, Derek Lee, Steve Christie and Stouffvilleites Craig Stronach, Jason Underwood and Paul Sinclair.

Murphy is also confident he will be able to pick up some quality hockey players from among the castoffs of the many Junior B camps that are already underway.

The Bruins will play their first exhibition game September 16 in Little Britain, while the season gets underway October 8 on the road. Their first home game is scheduled for October 13 at the Uxbridge Arena.
