## Track one step closer

Interim Stouffville District Secondary School Principal Alan Dickson met with student and staff officials Friday in what the group called the first of several steering committee meetings to plan a fund raising strategy for the school's proposed running track.

Physical Education Head Dave Connell and past Student Council President Julian Franklin briefed Mr. Dickson and new Student Council President Mike Pongraz as to the current status of the track, summarizing progress made last year.

Mr. Franklin explained how he had been received at a York Region Board of Education

Financial Committee meeting, during which the committee had agreed to recommend the School Board pledge up to \$125,000 towards the building of the long sought-after running facility.

The group then suggested names of Town residents, officials, and school students who might be approached to sit on the fund raising committee. Service clubs were also considered as possibilities.

Local companies, such as A&S Construction and Don Anderson Haulage, have already committed themselves to helping with the construction of the track, which is to be located directly to the east of the Recreation Centre.

Fund raising ideas were discussed, and it was decided to look into the possibility of holding a benefit rock concert at the school, using local talent such as ex-Lighthouse member Grant Fullerton, who has expressed interest in being involved in such a cause.

The group will meet again at the school Friday, at which time Mr. Dickson felt he would have had time to contact the Engineering Department of the School Board with regard to the process of drawing up plans for the track, and seeking tenders for the project.
