

Tour offers inside look at the farming industry

An inside look at the farming industry in the Stouffville area is being offered next month in a "Tour of Farms". Sponsored by the Stouffville Rotary Club and the York Federation of Agriculture, the tour will offer a first-hand look at five Whitchurch-Stouffville farms.

Beef, cash crop, dairy, horse and vegetable farming operations are highlighted in the tour.

It starts at the Stouffville Recreation Centre on Ninth Line on Oct. 14. Tickets and maps will be available at the Rec Centre from 10 a.m. until 2:30 p.m.

Participants who start the tour in the morning will have a chance to see three farms of their choice. The event will run rain or shine and participants are advised to wear sturdy shoes or boots if it is wet.

Things to see on the tour include a dairy operation which produces 1,200 litres of milk each day; Trakehner horses used in dressage and jumping competitions; cabbages and cauliflowers grown, cooled and packaged for two major grocery chains; beef cattle, from calves to market-ready steers in the feeder yard; a grain elevator and dryer and the largest available commercial free-moving spade.

Admission for the tour is \$5 for adults and \$2.50 for children under age 12. Proceeds from the event will be donated to the York Region Food Bank.

Baby's Butler offers a return to good old-fashioned diaper service

A resurrection of the once-popular diaper service for babies is making a comeback in the Whitchurch-Stouffville area.

Baby's Butler, a new service offered by Main Street businessman Tom Owen, brings back the convenience of diaper services after a long absence.

Mr. Owen, who opened for business at the beginning of September, is currently gearing up the new service, which offers customers a once or twice weekly pick-up and delivery package.

And it's a no muss, no fuss way to deal with messy diapers, he adds.

"You basically take the diaper off of the baby, throw it in the basket we provide and wait for us

to pick it up," said Mr. Owen at his Main St. office in Stouffville.

Gone, for those who may subscribe to Baby's Butler, are the days of disposable diaper piles and tape tabs. Mr. Owen says his diapers are made of 100 per cent natural cotton fibres which discourage rashes and allow tender skin to breathe.

And, he says, "cotton diapers just seem to be better for the babies themselves."

His formula is simple. He says he's simply taking advantage of a market that is seeking a return to

the traditional diaper service. And the downtown Stouffville location is central to other areas like Uxbridge in the northeast and Markham in the south.

"It seems to be the way to go," he says of newfound consumer interest in an old idea. "I don't know of any other diaper service in this area."

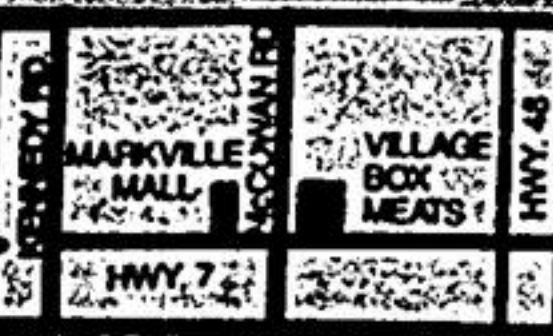

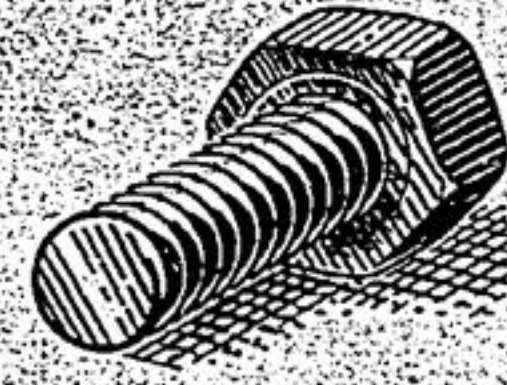

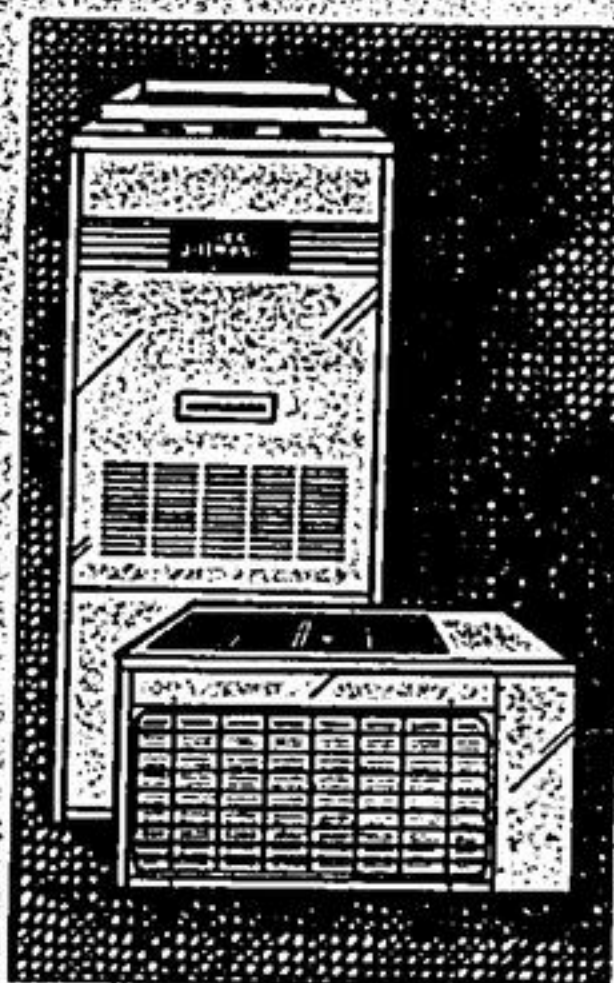
