Traction engines become more common in fall days of 1889

Here again are some items of interest called up from issues of *The Tribune* of years gone by:

100 years ago
Sept. 27, 1889: At this time of the year, it is no uncommon thing to see a traction engine slowly steaming its way along our quiet country roads. To one who meets it for the first time, the effect is somewhat uncanny. It looks wonderful to see this ponderous mass turning corners, and even completely turning around like an ordinary waggon, seemingly under the perfect control of its one manager. No doubt there are many living at the present day who will see not only loaded waggons, but light buggies, bowling along the highways with electricity as their motive power.

50 years ago
Sept. 28, 1939: Uxbridge voters Thursday defeated a proposal to allow the sale of beer by 639 to 215. Of some 1,000 voters on the roll 854 cast ballots. The town has been dry since 1916.

The temperance campaign was launched after a petition for a beer parlor had been circulated early in the summer. More than 25 per cent of the names on the voter's list necessary to force a vote were obtained. Church, business and community organizations united in a temperance federation headed by Mrs. Rev. P. G. Powell and J. Smith.

25 years ago
Oct. 1, 1964: On Wednesday evening, Oct. 14th, Mr. Roy Crosby, Main St. S. in Markham Village, will be singly honored through the dedication of a new \$175,000

public school in his name. Mr. Crosby who served as secretary of the trustee board in Markham for a period of 30 years, will cut the red ribbon to officially open the new eight-room structure.
