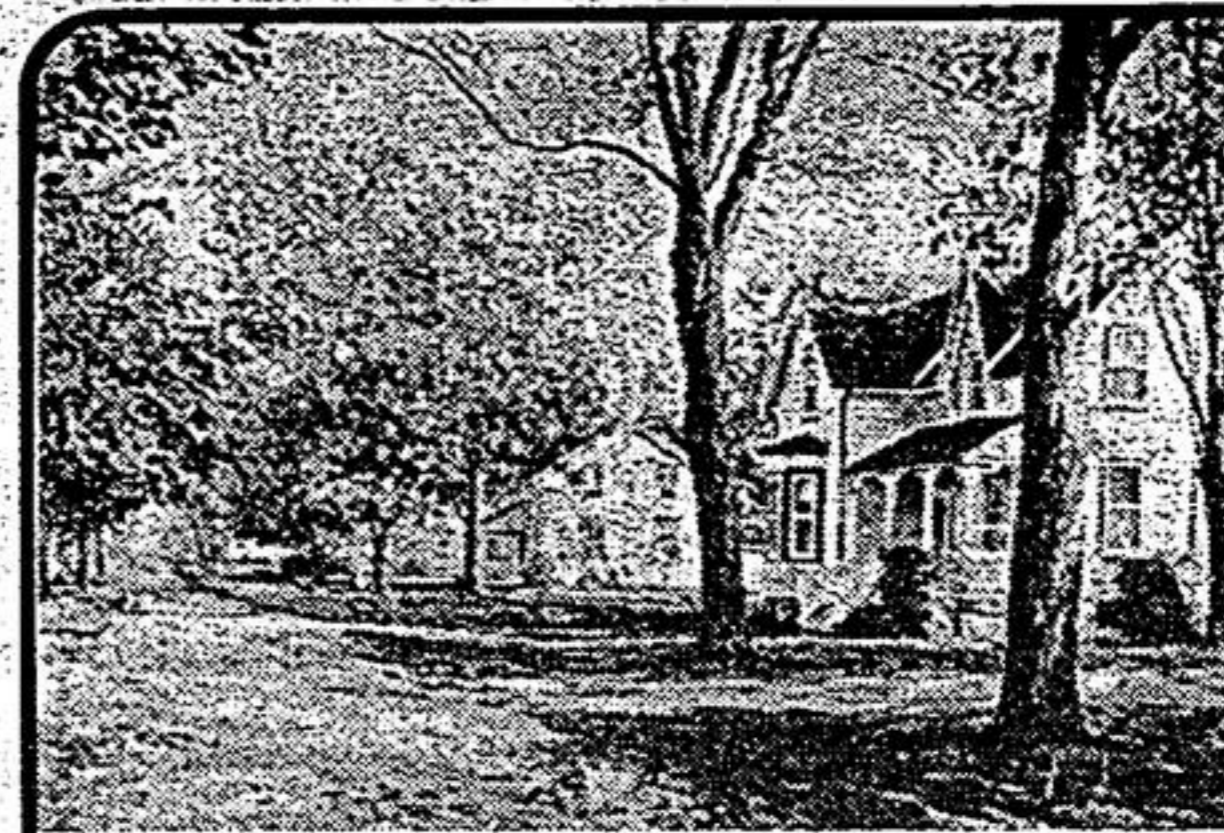
### Mon. Oct. 16

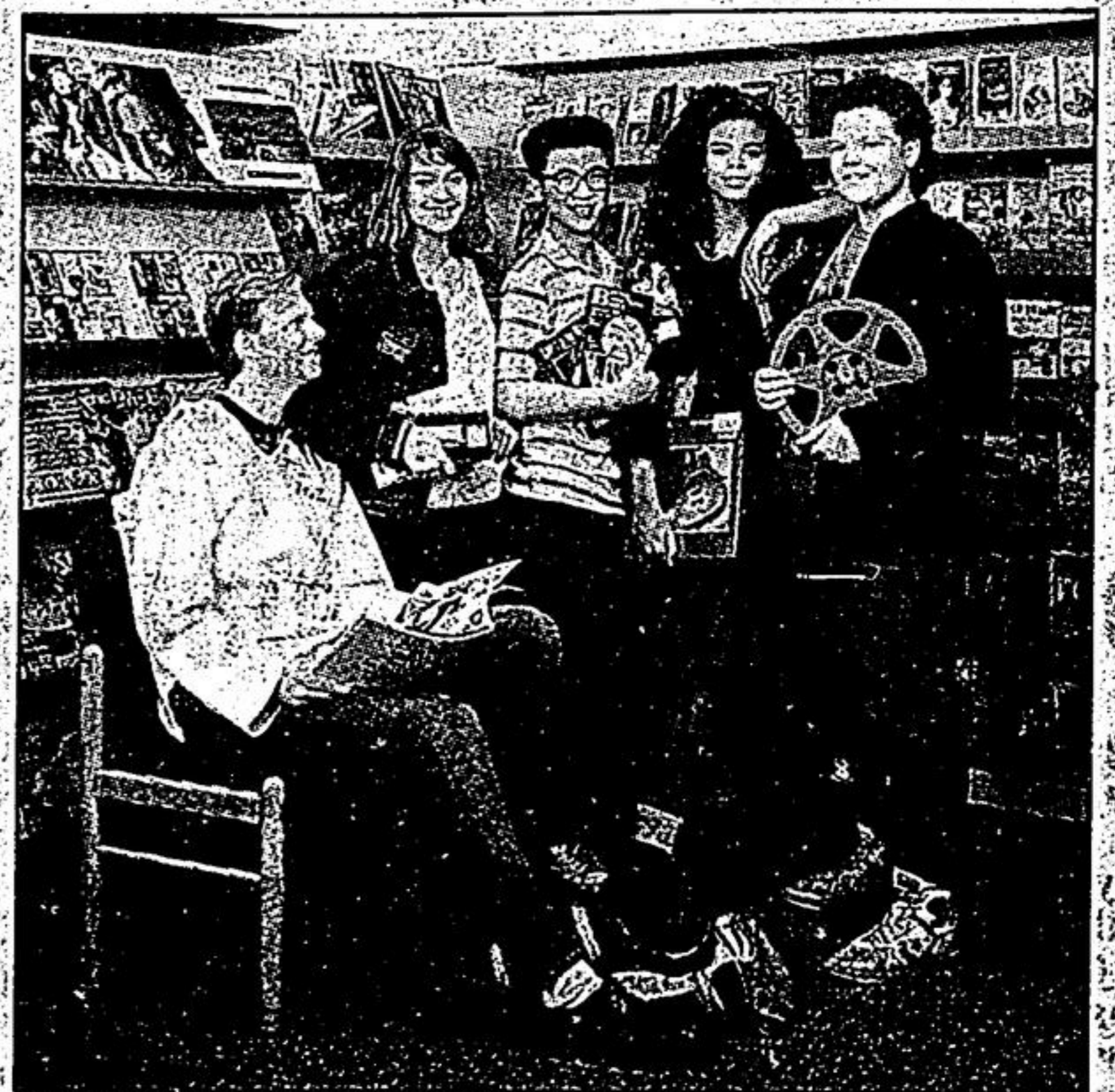
