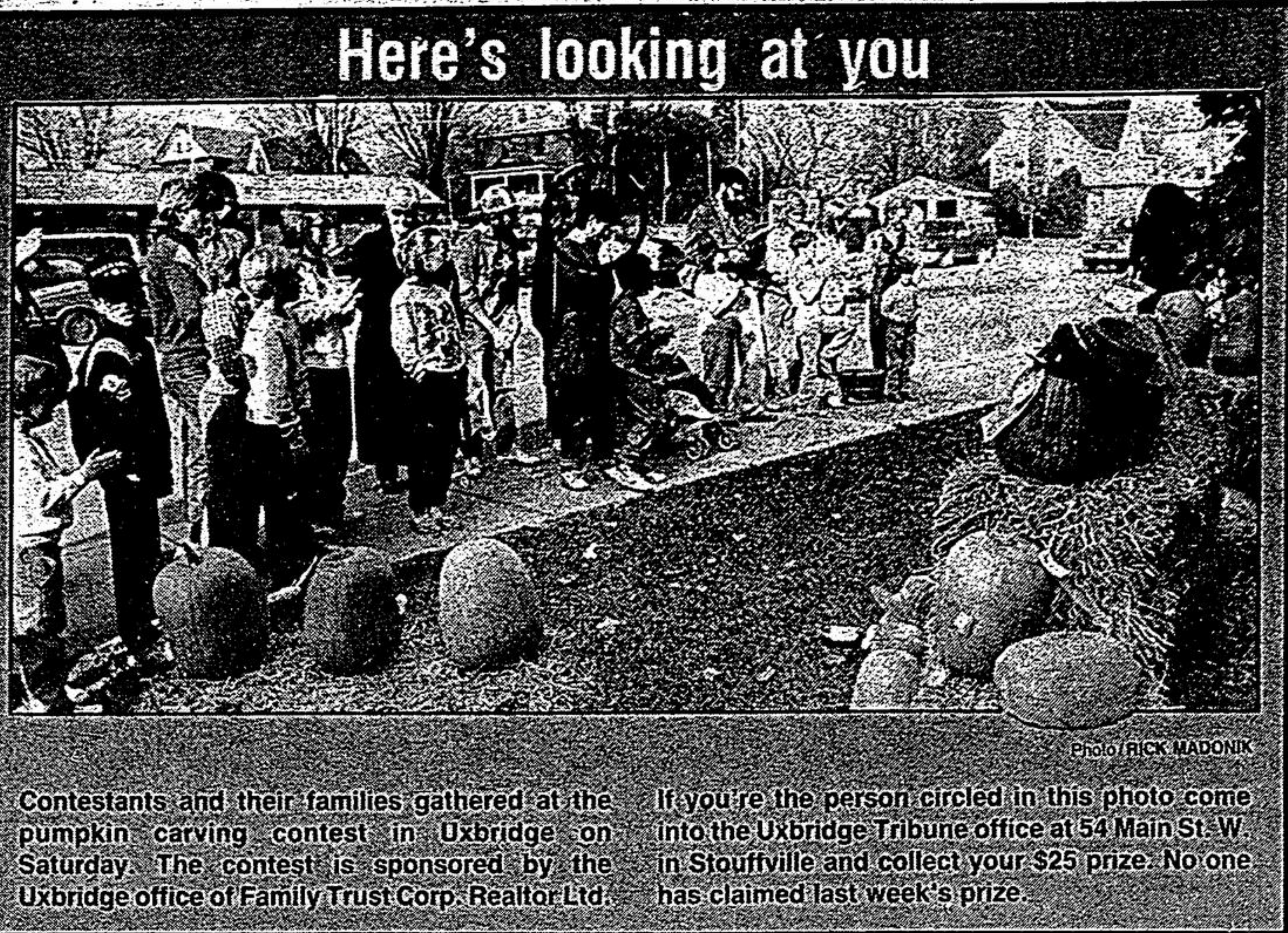

Claremont developer to foster business

A Claremont developer says he's prepared to offer rental assistance to certain businesses setting up shop in the hamlet's new light-industrial complex.

Karsten Smith of Claremont Developments is renovating the hamlet's old Sarco factory building at 5077 Old Brock Rd. N. He and partner Sal Arrigo plan to have the first of several rental units ready later in November.

"We're willing to participate to get anyone started in there," Mr. Smith says. "I'd like to hear from all interested parties. If (the business) is something of value to the community — like a plumber

— we'd even be interested in offering rental assistance."

Mr. Smith says the project is part of a push to attract more quality businesses and services to the North Pickering community.

The factory property's storage and light manufacturing zoning allows a wide variety of uses including service/repair shop, garage, furniture refinishing, woodworking/lumber processing and warehouse/distributing depot.

This type of industry would help establish a more viable business district and allow Claremont to keep pace with its growing residential area, Mr. Smith says.

The Durham Region hamlet is home to about 620 people, but the Town of Pickering's Hamlet Plan allows for future development that will boost Claremont's population to more than 1,000.

Claremont used to be a thriving rural community, however little new development has taken place there until recently.

Mr. Smith and company are working on other projects designed to help revitalize Claremont's downtown core.

A new restaurant opens later this year in an Ontario Picturesque-style house at the corner of Old Brock Rd. and Joseph St. An authentic English pub is also slated for the building, with Ron Tindley of Uxbridge's Hobby Horse Arms serving as project consultant.

Mr. Smith says the restaurant/pub will cater to the local walk-in trade. "I'm very open to suggestions at this point," says Smith, who can be contacted at 649-3112.

Postnatal classes for moms

A series of post-natal classes is being offered at various locations in York Region called Just for Mothers and Babies.
