

# Discipline keys Bantams

The Stouffville Bantam Clippers have made a discovery that might just turn their season around.

The Edwards-Murphy Decorating Bantams, who had slashed and brawled their way to a string of early season losses, found their offence works much better when they have the same number of skaters on the ice as the opposition.

The Clippers used their new found discipline to scratch out a 4-4 tie with Lindsay at the Rec Centre Monday, their first point of the season.

Dave Caramanico scored all four Stouffville goals. Joe Nucci had two assists.

But the Bantams big moral victory of the week was a tough 6-5 loss to Uxbridge Sunday on the road, in a game that saw Stouffville take only four minor penalties.

Steve Emes had a pair of goals for Stouffville, while Richard Barceley, Dan McNaught, and Caramanico counted singles.

The Clippers had been routed 9-0 by Uxbridge the previous week, racking up 18 minor penalties and a pair of majors.

But after receiving a tongue lashing from coach Joe Infurnari, the Bants started to play hockey, and team manger Wes Wilson thinks the results are starting to show.

"Up until last week, they had been taking lots of stupid penalties," said Wilson. "Joe told them that wasn't going to happen again. The big difference is that they found out it's better to play with five skaters on the ice than two or three."

In Uxbridge Sunday, the Clippers led 4-1 at one point in the second stanza, but the unbeaten Uxbridge squad came back to steal it with two goals in the third.
