A new Ski Resort,

over the Great Pine Ridge

A few minutes drive south of Uxbridge on Lakeridge Rd. (Durham Rd. 23) you'll see the new sign for Lakeridge Ski Resort at the corner of Chalk Lake Rd. You can drive into the ski complex this Sunday and check out this exciting new recreational facility. There's plenty of parking and an attendant on duty to answer questions about membership, etc.

Head west on Chalk Lake Rd. which winds around gentle hills over to Concession 7. Turn left here and go south through Glen Major, a tiny hamlet which has some interesting country homes.

A few minutes south of Glen Major after cross the railroad tracks, you'll come to Balsam, on Durham Rd. 5. On your left, at the corner, drop in at Gifts From The Earth, where you can learn about crystal healing and buy some frozen yogurt. Open 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Now head west along Durham Rd. for about a mile to Westney Rd. Turn right and go north past the Pickering Townline onto Concession 6 in Uxbridge, along this winding road for a mile to Gallery On The Hill where you can browse in the picture gallery of original paintings or climb up to the antique loft where you'll find furniture and collectables. They serve mulled cider on Sunday and will be giving away a FREE hand-colored print (16" x 20") with any purchase on Sun. Open 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

The road north of here winds through the woods and then offers a fine view of Uxbridge Township, since you are now on top of the Great Pine Ridge. You might want to drive on up to Uxbridge town where you'll find the Hobby Horse Arms, 43 Main St. N., a restored country Inn which offer lunch (starting at \$3.95) at noon or dinner (\$12.95 & up) served from 6 p.m. on.
