Keith McGuckin had two goals and an assist for the Caps, with Blair Purcell adding a goal, and

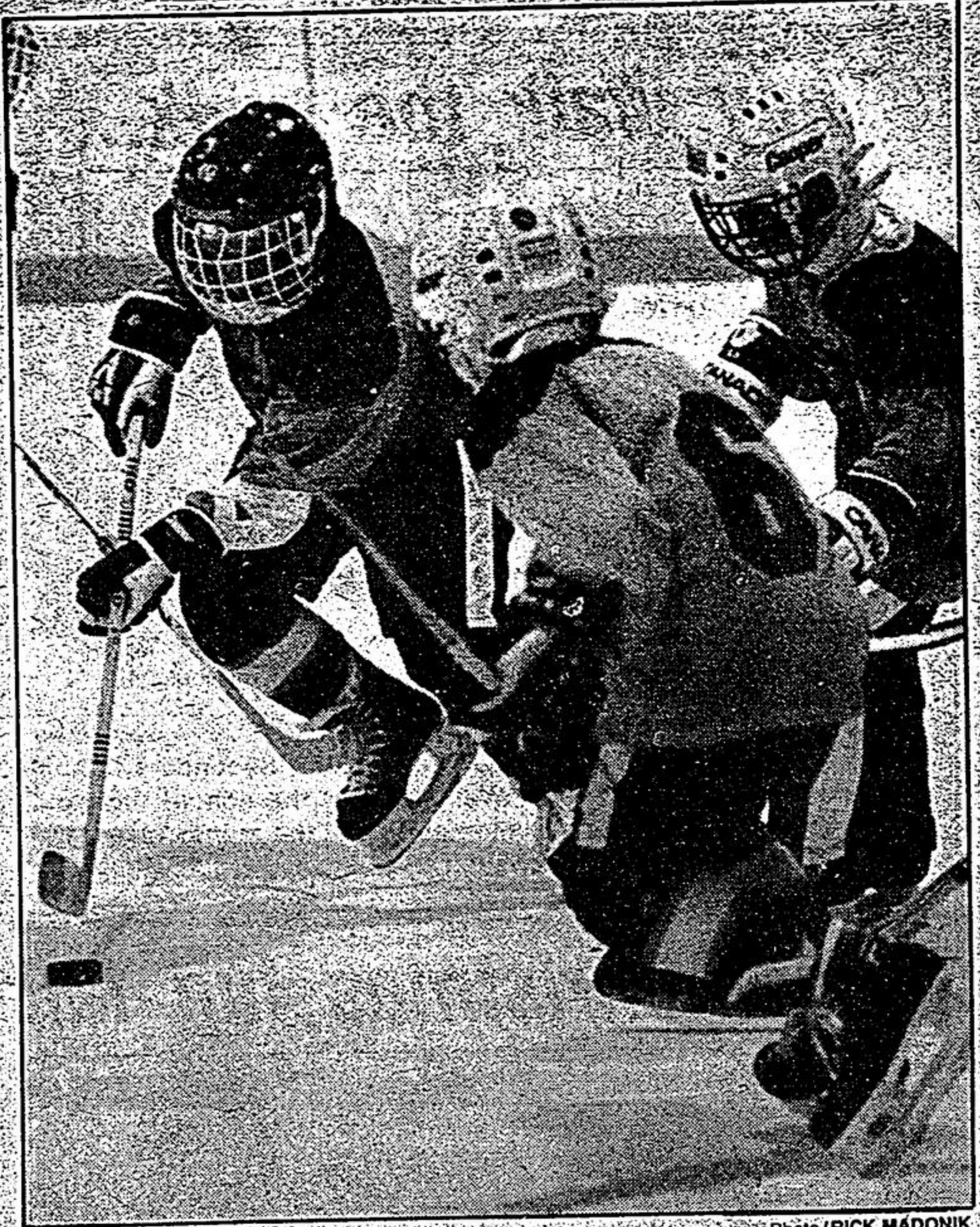
Peter Fitzpatrick two assists.

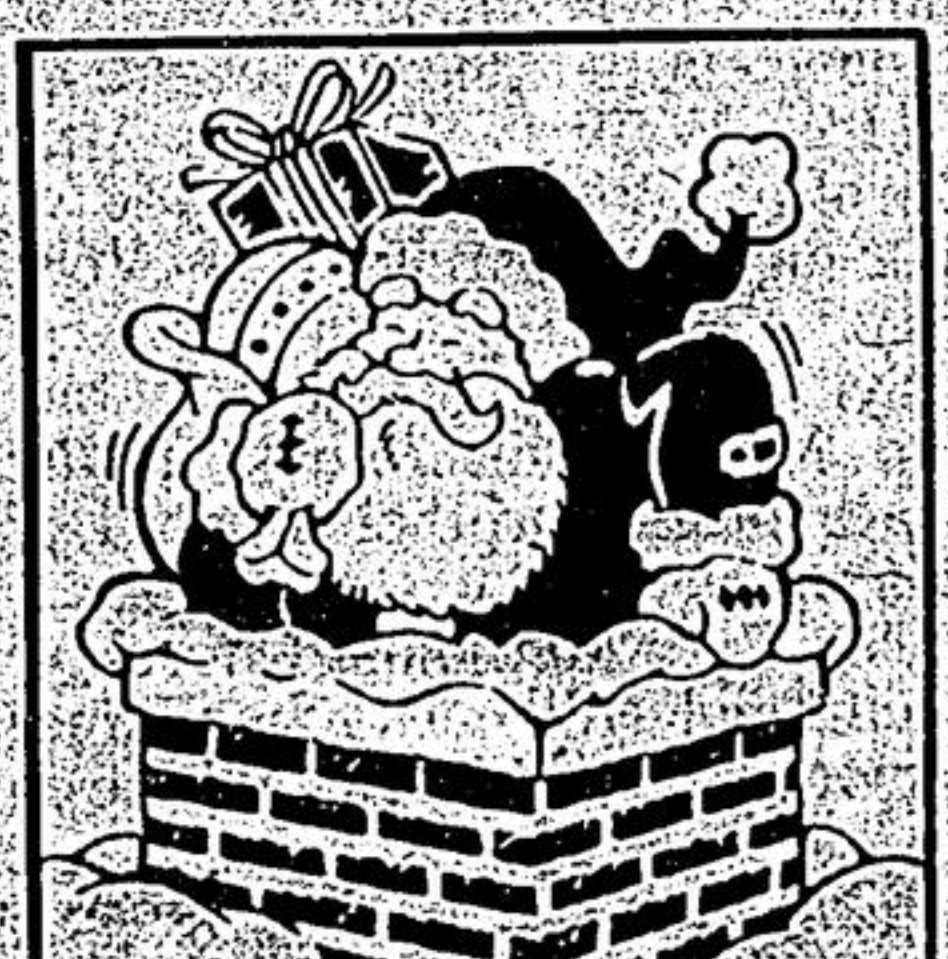
Assists went to Nicole Thornhill, Melissa Dawson, Shyla Brennan, Jennifer Norwood and Stephanie Summerhill.

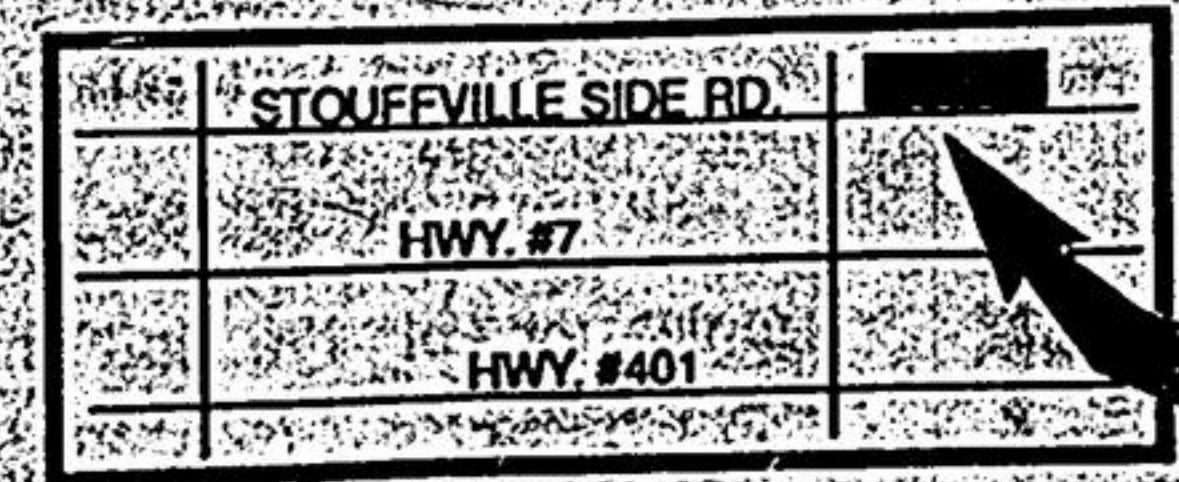
