In 1916...

Christmas day fire razes storehouse and contents

Here again are some items of interest called up from issues of *The Tribune* of years gone by:

73 years ago
Dec. 25, 1916: The firm of Todd & Cook incurred a big loss on Tuesday evening when, about 6:20 o'clock, fire broke out in their north storehouse near the station, which contained a large quantity of wheat, corn, oats, wool, gluten meal, oil cake, charcoal, plaster and a new 20-horsepower gasoline engine.

The building, a wooden structure with cement basement, and the contents proved an easy prey to the flames which, fanned by a strong wind, soon worked their way throughout the whole place. The work of the fire brigade was highly praiseworthy; many of the firemen stayed on duty all night, but in spite of their best efforts the building burned to the foundations and practically

the entire contents were destroyed.

The cause of the fire is unknown but the probability seemed to be that the origin was a locomotive spark.

50 years ago
Dec. 28, 1939: While enjoying the Christmas dinner at the home of his son in the village of Goodwood, William Bryan of that place thought he would stroll to his own home fireplace immediately after the meal just to make sure everything was all right and the fire in the stove burning properly.

As he opened the door of his

home, smoke belched out and it was found that a pile of wood at the back of the stove was burning, with the flames climbing up the wall as well as burning a hole in the floor. Damage amounting to \$200 was done before the blaze was put out.

25 years ago

Dec. 31, 1964: Two couples were forced out of their home on the Archie Little farm near Cedar Grove on Monday night when fire caused an estimated \$13,000 damage to the frame and brick structure. It is the second house on the property, built by Mr. Geo. Freeman in 901.
