York Police have registry listing Alzheimer sufferers

January was Alzheimer Awareness Month and the York Regional Police Force actively assisted local groups to heighten the awareness of this disease.

Disease currently affects 300,000 people, and will more than double by the year 2020. By that time, more than 700,000 Canadians will suffer from this disease.

On Tuesday, Feb. 27, The York force's hockey team is challenging the NHL Old Timer's at the Markham Centennial Arena. Contributions will be donated to the Alzheimer's Outreach Program.

The police force works closely with the DAY Centre (The Daycare for Alzheimer in York Region), according to a release.

Alzheimer's Disease is a disorder of the brain causing loss of memory and serious mental deterioration. It was first described by Alois Alzheimer, a German neurologist, in 1906.

Palliative care week declared

York Region has declared the week of Feb. 4-10 Palliative Care Awareness week.

Until recently, it was believed that only persons under age 65 developed the illness. However, tests have revealed that identical changes in the brain occur in persons over age 65.

Palliative care is the active, compassionate care of the sick at a time when disease is no longer responsive to curative treatment.

The York Regional police force, along with the Alzheimer Society of York Region, has a Wandering Person Registry Program for those suffering from the disease.

"The issues surrounding death and dying are scary and are often avoided in our society, but the focus of palliative care is on helping the terminally ill and their families to live their lives to the fullest," said Joan Tobe, president of Palliative Care Services for York Region, in a release.

The purpose of the registry is to assist York Regional Police to quickly identify and return lost or wandering persons to their caregiver.

The week has been planned by a committee of representatives of local hospitals, hospices, nursing agencies and other health service groups. Organizers plan to make it an annual event.

Police officials advise local residents that if they are put on the Wandering Persons file, their names will not show as a criminal on police files nor will the information be given out to anyone.
