66 years ago

That Martha Hyland, the 55-year-old woman found dead on a lonely farm in Whitchurch Township on Dec. 27 last was the victim of foul work was the finding of the coroner's jury which sat here last night. The verdict read that the jurors believed death due to a blow on the head by a party or parties unknown.

Important testimony was given by a brother, Henry Hyland, and by Dr. F.J. Boyd and Dr. A. Webb, both of Newmarket, who performed the autopsy.

50 years ago

Shortly after 4:45 a.m. last Friday, a milk bottle containing a newspaper clipping of a story in which Rev. E. C. French, B.D., minister of Wesley United Church, Toronto, and former pastor at Lemonville, criticized eight gambling resorts on the outskirts of the city, was thrown through the front window of Mr. French's home at 27 Concord Ave.

Mr. French said that he had called the police after being awakened by the crash of broken glass. Police reported that Sgt. George Eagleson and P. C. Burney had investigated, but a search of the streets in the vicinity revealed no clue that would lead to the identity of

those who threw the bottle.

25 years ago

The much-publicized organization of Farmers Allied Meat Enterprises Co-operative Ltd., or FAME as it is known, is currently in a state of bankruptcy with a resultant loss to shareholders of an estimated \$1½ million.

The former owner of the meat-packing plant, E. R. Gunner, has reclaimed the building at Burlington, valued at \$3½ million. He has refused to refund the organization's initial \$1.5-million payment. A shareholders' meeting was held at Brampton last week.

Merlyn Baker of R. R. 2 Stouffville, one of 18 directors in the firm, refused to minimize the seriousness of the situation in a telephone conversation with *The Tribune*. He had earlier submitted his resignation from the board but, in the vote that followed, was re-elected.

10 years ago

"Cover them up or else!" That was the order issued by York Regional Police after two officers visited The King's Inn at Ballantrae, armed with a copy of Whitchurch-Stouffville's recently-approved entertainment bylaw.

The ruling makes it mandatory that performers, both male and female, be properly clothed in certain prescribed areas of their anatomies.
