No transfer

Sewage hook-up bid nixed

Whitchurch-Stouffville Council told a resident Tuesday he could not transfer a sewage hook-up allowance to a 3/4-acre vacant lot.
 David Moyer, who lives at 520 Millard Street in Stouffville, wants to forfeit sewage allocation at his present house and have it transferred to a new lot.

His house is presently on septic system and Council in September said the existing dwelling was "permitted to connect to the municipal services on Millard

Street and any connect fee be waived."

But Mr. Moyer would like to have the existing dwelling remain on septic and have the allowed connection be transferred to a vacant lot he wants to sever.

"This situation is quite unique and deserves consideration as prior applications for sewage allocation have been refused," he wrote in a letter to council.

Even though the York Region health unit support the "merits of the proposal" from Mr. Moyer, local officials would not allow the transfer of services to the vacant lot because municipal con-

nection would have to remain on the existing house as outlined in the hook-up boundaries.

Council pointed out that people before him have requested similar action and were turned down.

"What about the other people who have come before council requesting allocation and we've turned them down. This may be precedent-setting," said Ward 2 Councillor Ron Robb.

"We want to be fair to everybody," Councillor Robb added.

Council voted to have staff prepare a report and list the number of other applicants that have made such a request in the past.

WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM FOR PROPOSED INDUSTRIAL PARK IN TOWNSHIP OF UXBRIDGE

NOTICE OF COMPLETION OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY REPORT

21 MARCH 1990

As a requirement under Ontario's Environmental Assessment Act, the Regional Municipality of Durham and 454790 Ontario Limited hereby notifies all interested individuals and parties that the Environmental Study Report (ESR) for the above-mentioned project has been completed. Subject to the comments received as a result of this Notice and the receipt of other approvals as necessary, the Regional Municipality of Durham and 454790 Ontario Ltd. intend to proceed with the construction of the above-mentioned project.

The proposed water supply system will consist of two wells (one of which will be a standby supply) a wellhouse containing the duty well pump, standby diesel generator, and chlorination facilities; a 2500 m³ capacity elevated water storage tank approximately 35 m in height, and distribution water mains constructed within road allowances of the development. The works will be contained within the limits of the proposed development, which is a 92 ha parcel of industrial land immediately north of Highway No. 47 and immediately west of Regional Road 30. The total capital cost of the water supply system is estimated at \$2,500,000, all of which will be paid for by the land developer, 454790 Ontario Limited. On commissioning, the Regional Municipality of Durham will assume ownership of the system and will operate and maintain it. Subject to receipt of all required approvals, the system will be constructed in 1990.

Interested individuals and parties have 30 calendar days from the date of this Notice to comment on the proposal. Comments must be made in writing and must be received by the Municipal Office on or before 20 April 1990.

If concerns regarding this project cannot be resolved, an individual or party may request that the Minister of the Environment "bump-up" this project to an individual environmental assessment. Bump-up requests must be submitted to the address below. If there are no concerns expressed by the above date, the Water Supply System will proceed to construction as presented in the ESR.
