Individual steps aid environment

Dear Editor,
This is an open letter to all your Stouffville and Uxbridge Tribune readers:

Fellow Earthlings!
Sunday April 22 was everyone's Mother's Day - Earth Day 1990. Marking the beginning of a new decade of caring for our common home and source of all life, it was a day for each of us to stop talking about the Earth's troubles and do something positive to start solving its problems ourselves.

Here are some ways to either start the process of healing the planet or to honor your own special sense of connection to Mother Earth:

Try to think of alternatives to these products, such as water and vinegar to replace window cleaner. Resolve to dispose of these products by calling the Toxic Taxi (in Durham Region).

- * Contact your neighbors and organize a collection of household hazardous wastes, so that the Toxic Taxi only has to come to one house.

Inform your neighbors that motor oil, batteries, drain cleaner, solvents and paint thinners, pesticides and herbicides should never go to the landfill, but should be picked up by the Toxic Taxi.

- * Resolve to attend all the information meetings about waste disposal and environmental management you can.

- * Hug a tree, kiss the Earth, chant "Om..."

- * Put up a clothesline so you can save on hydro usage.

As a philosopher once said: "A journey of a thousand miles begins with one step."

Whatever steps you take to help clean up the environment is a great one.

You will have made the effort to make a difference and it's only when we all live each day with the planet's good health in mind that we will ensure a happy, healthy future for generations to come.
