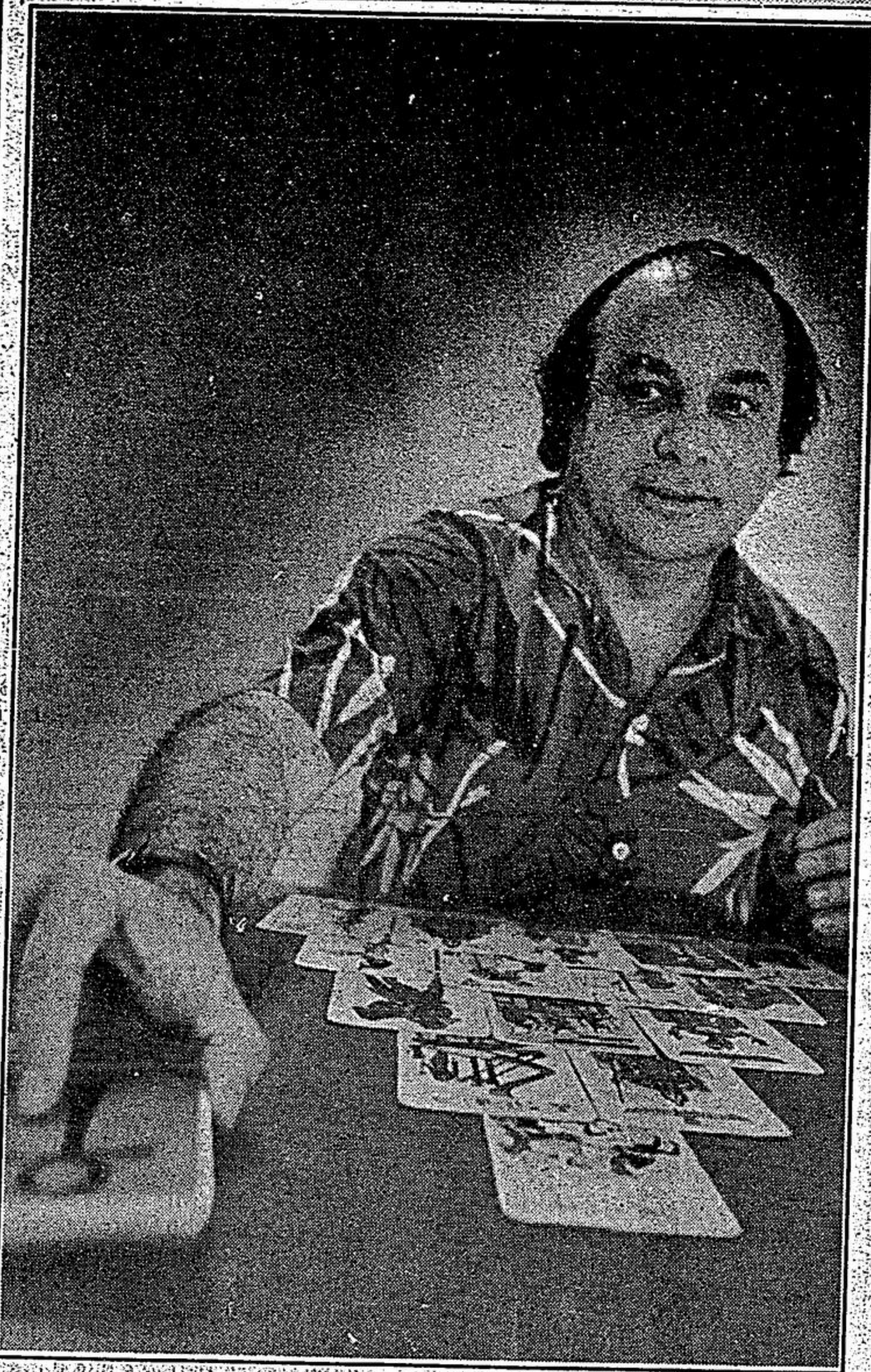


Back to the future at the Stouffville Psychic Fair

Scouts Pitch-In to help environment

Environmentally friendly Beavers, Cubs and Scouts did their part in helping clean-up Stouffville last week, as part of Pitch-In Week celebrations.

Nearly 100 boys aged six to 13, along with their leaders, participated in the project as the 3rd pack's contribution towards cleaning up the Stouffville community.

Pitch-In Week was observed across the province and in other parts of Canada between May 7 and 13, and an estimated 2.3 million Canadians took part.

Projects undertaken included cleaning up neighborhoods, parks and wilderness areas, to promoting recycling and the need for Canadians to reduce the amount of waste they produce.

"Keeping the environment clean is most important.

Our clean-up will help impress upon our Beavers, Cubs and Scouts, as well as others in the community, the amount of waste which is disposed of improperly or mismanaged," said David Grimes, Akela of the cub pack.

"Even though cleaning up is important, educating people to reduce, re-use, recycle and properly manage the remainder is the most important."

This is the first year the 3rd Stouffville Scouting pack participated in Pitch-In Week.

Last year, Cubs collected garbage from Stouffville neighborhoods and Bruce's Creek.

This year, the group's clean-up activities were focused in the parks and recreation areas, around schools and churches, and along the town's Main Street.
