

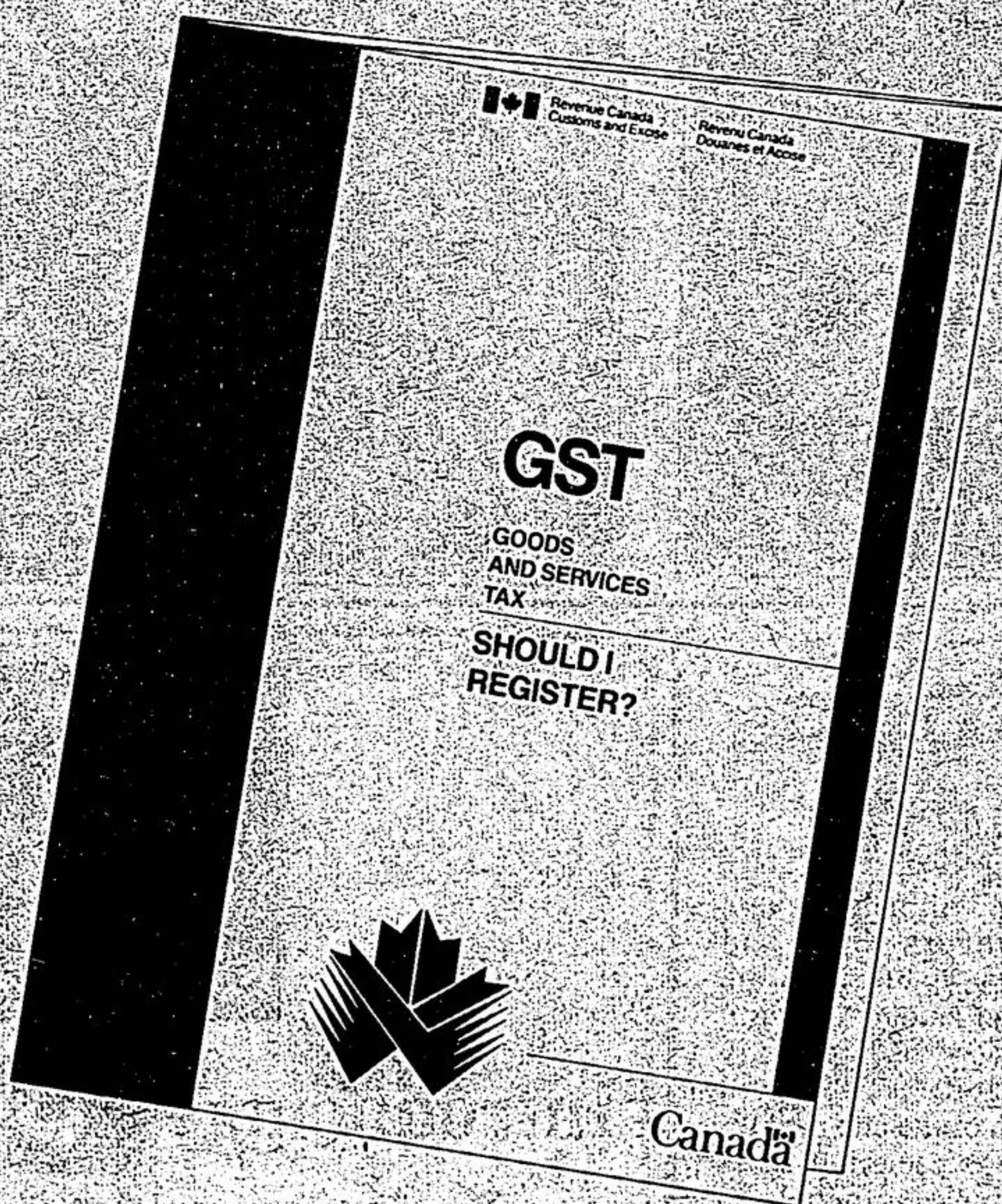
Stouffville Newcomers Club celebrates
