NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING
LOCATIONAL CRITERIA
FOR GOLF COURSES
TOWN OF PICKERING

In November, 1989, Pickering Town Council passed a resolution requesting the Director of Planning to prepare a policy that will establish locational criteria for golf courses. Once established, these criteria would be used in the review of development proposals for golf courses. Planning staff is now prepared to present and discuss its finding and conclusions.

You are cordially invited to attend a public meeting of the Planning Committee of Council to be held in the Civic Complex, One The Esplanade, commencing at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, June 20, 1990. A policy for golf courses will be one of a number of items considered by Planning Committee that evening.

A related matter will also be considered by Planning Committee on June 20. A Recommendation Report on Official Plan Amendment Application 89-123/D, submitted by Mr. C. de Graauw, to permit a nine-hole golf course on lands at the southwest corner of Regional Road 5 and Westney Road will also be considered.

Copies of the Planning Report on the Golf Course Policy, and copies of the Recommendation Report on the de Graauw proposal will be available from the Clerks Department commencing June 15, 1990.
