Mrs. George Sider has returned from a delightful two-week tour of England.

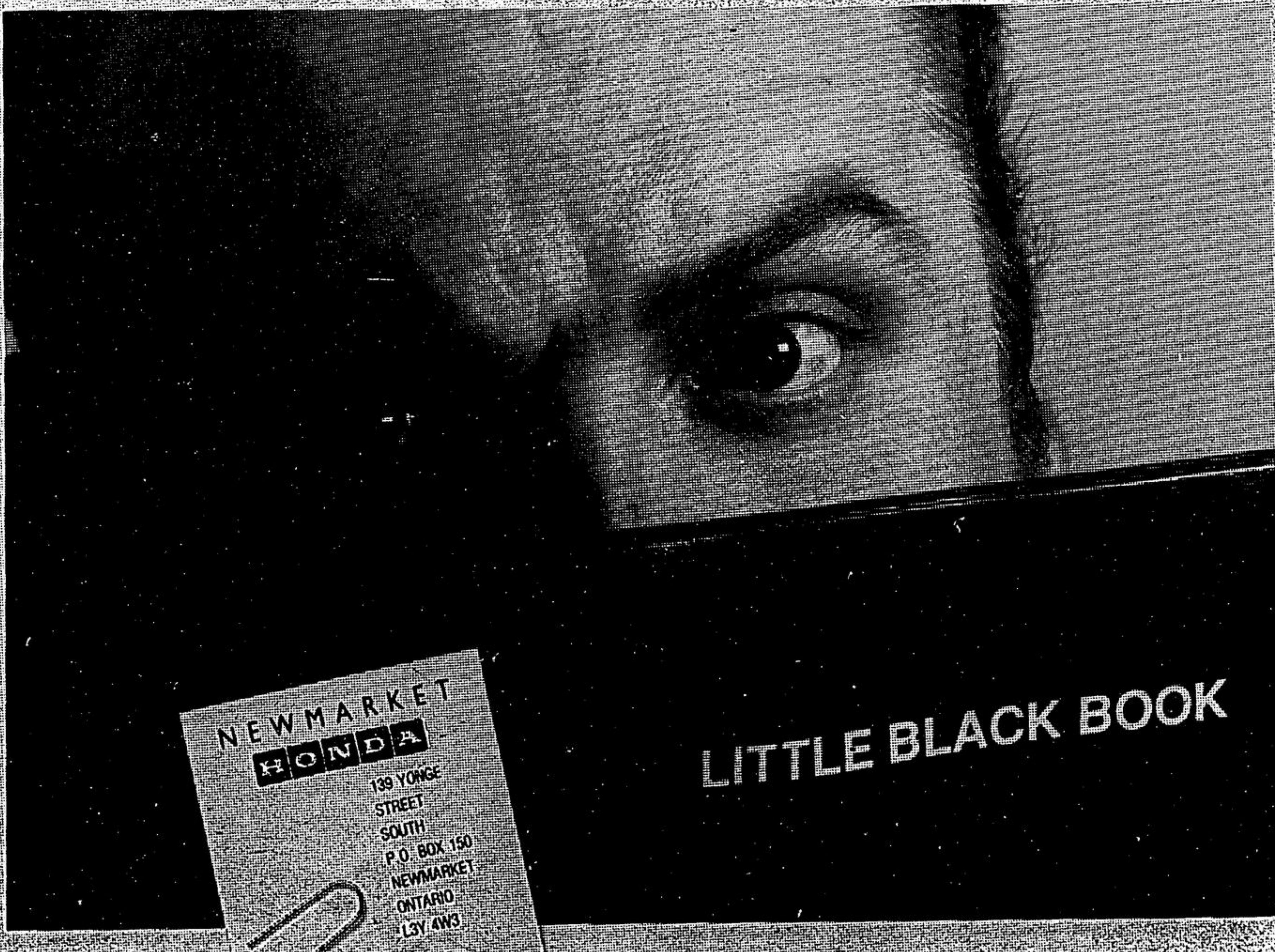
