

Stouffville Midgets avenge three early season losses

The Stouffville Midget softball team continued their upward surge last Monday with a 12-6 win over the Pickering Kinsmen.

The Stouffville club, which lost the first three games of the season, have now won three in a row.

Matthew McKnight spearheaded the Stouffville attack Monday, collecting a double and two singles, while scoring four runs.

Greg Spitz had a triple and two runs, and David Carmanico doubled and scored twice.

Also, Dan McNeil, who had homered earlier in the day to give the Stouffville District Secondary School Spartans the York Region high school championship, added a pair of singles for two RBIs.

Mike Pongracz went the dis-

tance on the mound for Stouffville, scattering seven hits while striking out five Pickering batters.

In earlier action, the Midgets earned their first win of the season by beating Pickering 8-6. The Stouffville boys took their second win of the year over Bramalea 13-2, avenging an earlier one-run loss.

In the 8-6 win over Pickering, McNeil and Bill Pride paced the Stouffville offence with home runs.

Pongracz and Jodi Infurnari shared the pitching duties, and had great defensive support.

The Midgets three season open-

ing losses were all close decisions as they were beaten 5-3 by Greenbank, 4-3 by Bramalea and 4-3 by Newmarket.

In avenging the loss to Bramalea, the Stouffville boys were led by Basil Luciano's three-hit, three RBI performance.

Jason Underwood added a pair of singles and three RBIs, while Jason Cowan and Bill Pride had two RBIs each.

Pitcher Infurnari tossed a five-hitter and struck out three for the win.


