 "The school has grown tremendously since I started; then there were 200 students and 13 teachers, we now have 2,200 students and 150 teachers."

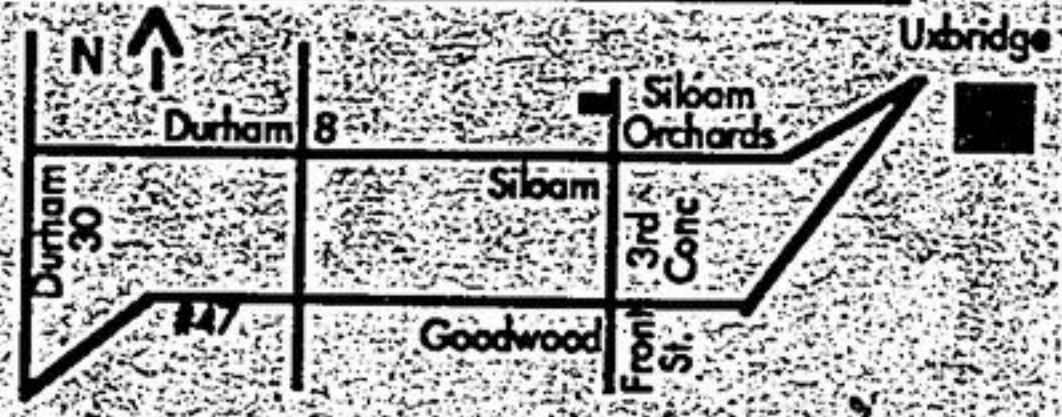

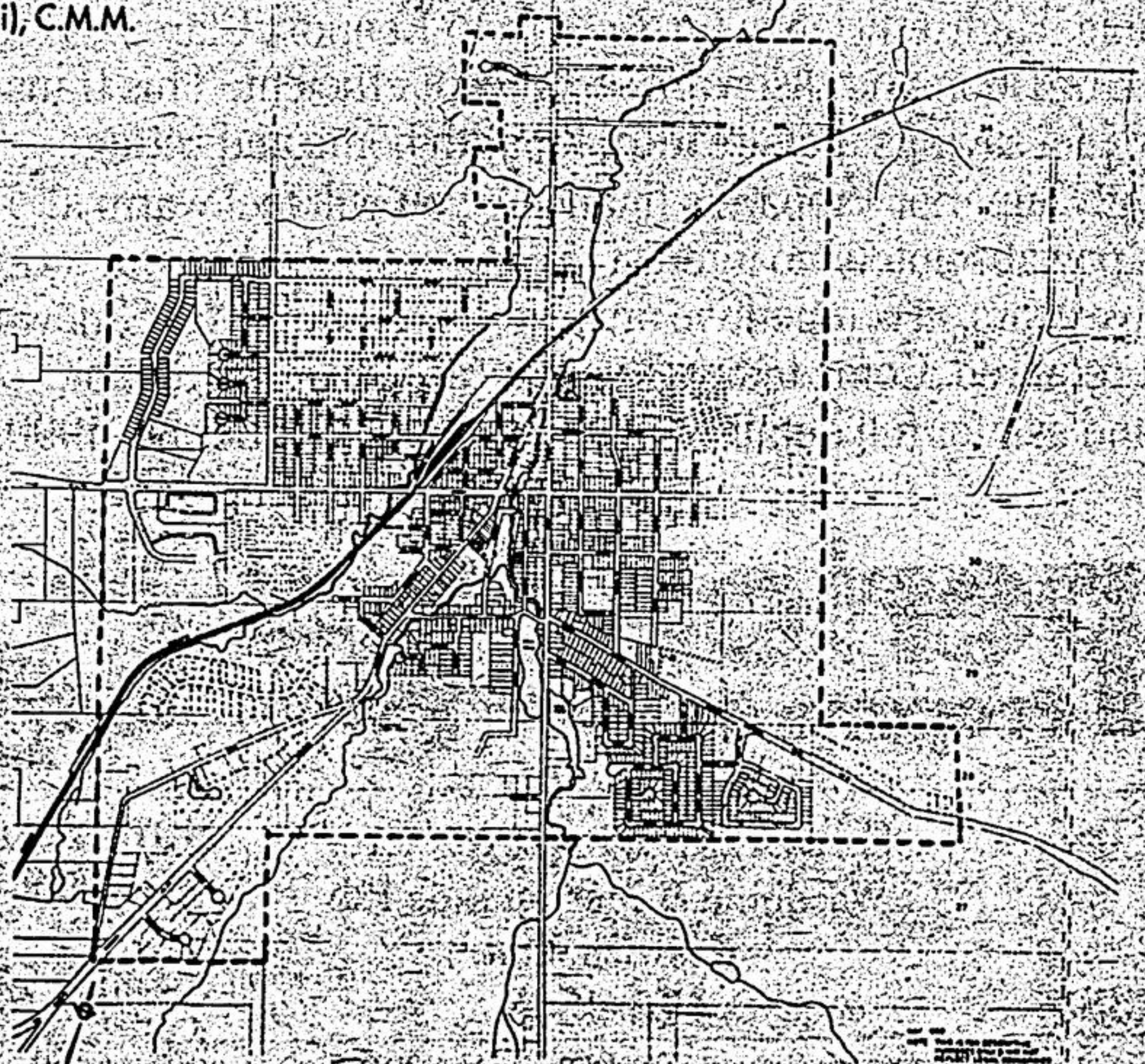
