

## Atom Clippers beat Uxbridge

The Stouffville Boyd's Sports and Cycle Atom Clippers were 500 as they took to the road for contests with three of their Lakeshore League rivals recently.

Port Perry avenged an earlier defeat at the hands of the Clippers when they posted a 2-1 victory.

The next game saw Stouffville prevail 5-1 over Uxbridge, and the Clippers settled for a 1-1 tie in Port Hope the next day.

Ryan King scored from Grahame Smith early in the opening period against Port Perry, but the Clippers

couldn't find the target the rest of the way.

The Boyd's boys collected their second win of the season, as Jason Brown was denied his shutout when Jason Bonner scored for Uxbridge with only four seconds left in the game.

King notched a pair of markers for the Clippers, with Andrew Hutchison, Shawn Carruthers and Rob Spytz adding singles.

Assists went to Brad Johnston and Carruthers, with two each, Hutchison, Spytz, Matt Turner, Kyle Harrison, and Rob Tilley.

Tilley was taken to Uxbridge Cottage Hospital with a shoulder injury after a mid-ice collision.

King set up Dan Tardella for the Clippers lone marker in their draw with Port Hope.

Three individuals and four teams will be honored for their provincial athletic achievements this Thursday night at the Recreation Centre Lounge.

The annual event, which begins at 7:30 p.m. and is open to the public, acknowledges all Whitchurch-Stouffville athletes and teams who win an Ontario championship.

Topping this year's list are the Stouffville Merchants Junior boys fastball team, which took their Ontario title, and went on to finish fourth in the national finals in Quebec last August.

The team was put together and managed by Carl Myers, who had also guided his Whitchurch-Stouffville Vandorf Juniors to the All-Ontario crown in 1988.

The Stouffville Mite Rowntree Buttermakers, and the Stouffville Choko Design Squirts will also be given medals for their provincial softball cham-

pionships this past summer, while the Betz Pools Ladies Slo-Pitch team will be congratulated for its Ontario Ladies Coors title.

Holly Garbutt, who received the High Point Youth Driving Championship Award for the Ontario Morgan Horse Club for the 1989 season;

Andrea Zemp, who won the Ontario Morgan Horse Club Ontario High Point Equitation Championship, which is awarded to the rider with the highest number of firsts in Showmanship, Equitation, English Pleasure and Versatility;

Michael Brett, the swimmer who won three gold medals in the Triple A Team Championship in Sudbury in February in 1989. He also broke a provincial record participating in a Free Medley Relay event.
