Track blitz nets nearly \$4,000

Stouffville District Secondary School students, teachers, and volunteers hit the streets last Tuesday night in a door-to-door campaign to solicit financial support for the Whitchurch-Stouffville Community Track and Field Project.

The blitz, which is the first step in raising the approximately \$86,000 still required to complete construction of the outdoor athletic facility, netted just under \$4,000 in donations.

Track Committee officials are hopeful that follow up pledges will cause that amount to double.

"Many people took the forms and told us they would decide within the next few days how much they could give," said committee chairman Ged Stonehouse.

"The volunteers were really excited about the prospect of another \$4-5,000 coming in as a result of their work."

The track, soccer and tennis facility is a joint project, with funding coming from the York Region Board of Education, the town and the private sector.

Various local businesses have donated machinery and materials for the construction of the facility, which has been underway since early October.
