WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION

Notice of Hydro Rate Increase New Monthly Retail Rates Effective January 1, 1991.

The Commission has been notified by Ontario Hydro that wholesale electricity rates to our Utility will be increased by 8.7%. As this accounts for over 85% of our operating budget, it will be necessary to increase our rates by the same amount. This was achieved through careful budgeting to carry on our continuous upgrading programme.

The following rates, pending Ontario Hydro approval, will apply to all power used on and after January 1, 1991.

Our customers should also be aware that, should G.S.T. receive Government approval, their hydro bills will also include that 7% tax. Prior to this time, electricity has not been subject to taxation of any kind.
