New Election for the Office of Councillor Ward 2

In accordance with the Municipal Elections Act, 1980, as amended, the New Election for the office of Councillor Ward 2 will be held on:

Polling Day
MONDAY, FEBRUARY 25th, 1991

between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. at the Whitchurch-Stouffville Centennial Centre (also known as the Ballantrae Community Centre)

ADVANCE POLLS

An Advance Poll for the purpose of receiving the votes of Electors who expect to be unable to vote on polling day, will be held, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on:

Saturday, February 16th, 1991
and
Thursday, February 21st, 1991

at the Whitchurch-Stouffville Centennial Centre

PROXY VOTING

Any person appointed to vote by proxy must apply to the Clerk of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, on the prescribed form, not later than 5:00 p.m. on Polling Day to have the necessary certificate issued. Applications for proxy voting certificates should be secured from the Clerk's office in advance of this date.

QUALIFICATIONS OF AN ELECTOR

During the period from January 20th, 1991 to February 3rd, 1991

- a) is a resident in Ward 2; or
- b) is the owner or tenant of land in Ward 2 or the spouse of such owner or tenant;
- c) is a Canadian Citizen; and
- d) has attained the age of eighteen years or on or before the Polling Day will attain the age of eighteen years.

Persons not eligible to be entered on the revised List of Electors, but since the period of revisions have become a Canadian Citizen, may apply to the Clerk for a certificate to vote on Polling Day.

PRELIMINARY VOTERS LIST

IF YOU HAVE RECENTLY CHANGED YOUR PLACE OF RESIDENCE, your name may not appear on the Voters List at your new address. Preliminary Voters List shall be posted January 11th, 1991, in the Clerk's Department in the Town office, in the Library and in the Whitchurch-Stouffville Centennial Centre. Electors should examine the list to ensure that their names and relevant information are correctly shown.

Applications for inclusions, additions or corrections to or deletions from the list, may be made by an elector by completing and filing a form obtainable at the Clerk's Department, Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, 19 Civic Avenue, Stouffville, weekdays commencing February 11th, 1991, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

NOTE: The last day for filing applications to amend the preliminary Voters List is **Friday, January 25th, 1991.**

TO ELECTORS

Electors are urged to vote early to avoid possible congestion at the polls.

OFFENCES, PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT

- Every person who, at an election,
- a) not being qualified to vote, votes;
 - b) being qualified to vote, votes more times than he is authorized to vote by this Act; or
 - c) votes in a polling subdivision other than one in which he is entitled to vote by this Act;

is guilty of a corrupt practice and is liable to a fine of not more than \$2,000, or to imprisonment for a term of not more than six months, or to both.
