

Whitchurch-Stouffville council in brief

Bloomington water update
Ward 4 Councillor Wayne Emmerson wanted to know last week the status of the Bloomington water project and said he has had several calls from residents regarding the issue.

Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Works Director Paul Whitehouse told officials it is unlikely construction will begin this year because of well-testing concerns.

Mr. Whitehouse said the last report he has received from York Region indicated there are some

delays in the water testing but added he is trying to get more clarification.

"It all depends on the Environmental Assessment process," Mr. Whitehouse said.

Water complaints
Whitchurch-Stouffville communal water system is tested weekly and has been passing lab tests, local officials were told last week.

Ward 4 Councillor Wayne Emmerson said residents have been complaining of a high-chlorine smell in town and wanted to know

the testing process.

But Town Public Works Director Paul Whitehouse said the test results are passing tests but that he is aware of complaints of dirty, rusty water coming from pipes.

Mr. Whitehouse maintains the rusty color is caused when the water mains are flushed, which disturbs the system and causes problems.

However he maintains the problem is harmless to people's health.

East end minerals
Meanwhile, Ward 5 Councillor Doug Alles said the east end of town has had a high content of calcium counts causing water to take on a yellowish tinge.

Mr. Whitehouse maintains the east end water is tested for potability regularly and added calcium is related to the hardness of the water.

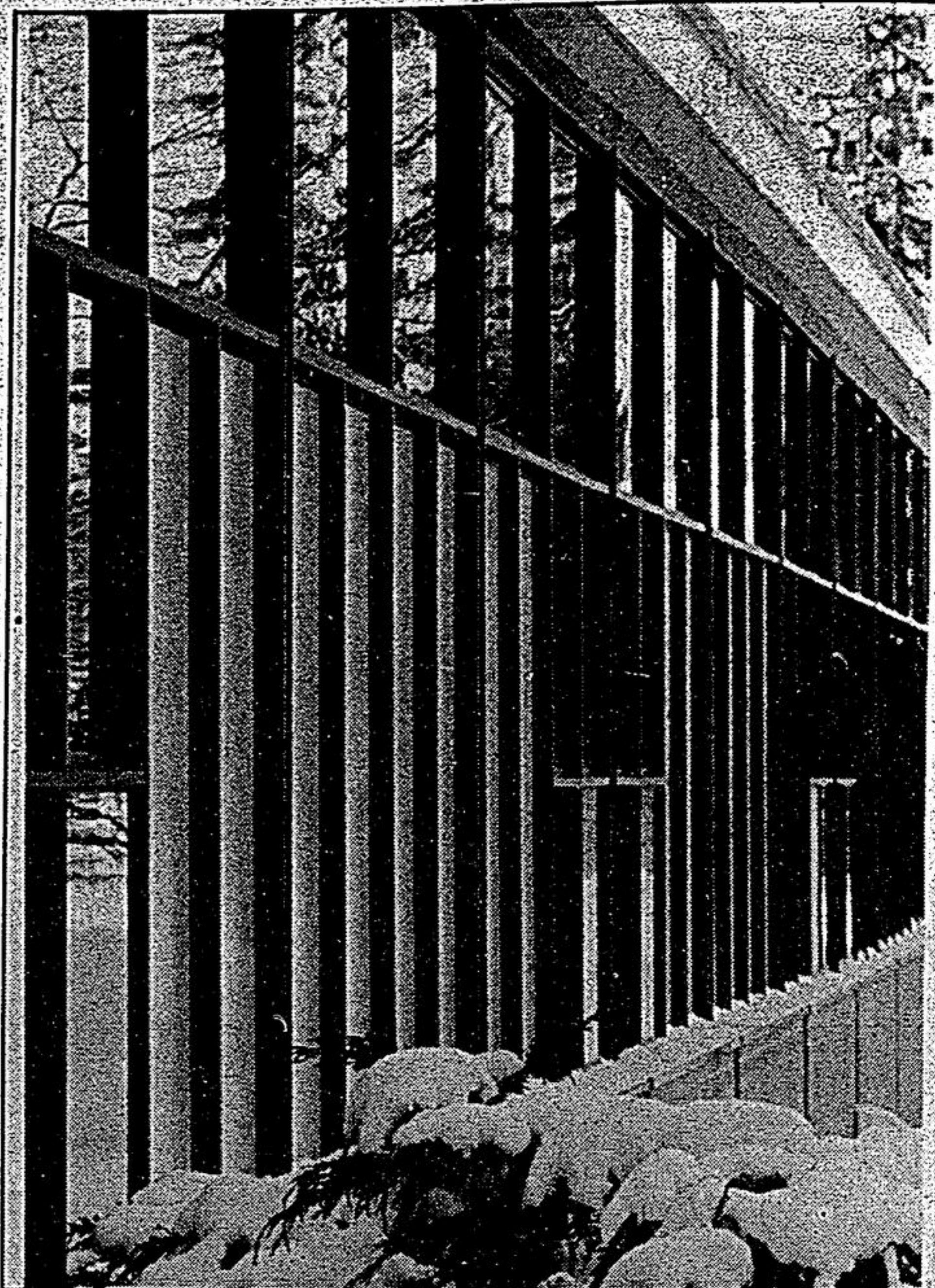
He told officials he would investigate the problem further.

The bylaw officers will look into the problem, it was decided.
