### Board expects more slashing to 1991 budget

The York Region Roman Catholic Separate School Board will hold a special meeting to discuss further cuts to its budget.

The meeting is set for 7:30 p.m. March 19 at the board's education centre, 21 Dunlop St. in Richmond Hill and trustees will consider the elimination of 89 education assistants which could impact on the board's mainstreaming program. So far, the board has pared more than \$3.5 million from its budget. Through increased walking distances for elementary students, making more use of municipal transit systems, cutting some late run services and staggering school start times, Elementary summer school has been eliminated and secondary summer school will be offered only if numbers ensure full cost recovery.

Instituting a minimum class size in French immersion will save money, and if the set pupil-teacher ratio drops in any class, it will be discontinued. Heritage language has also been dropped at the Kindergarten levels.

General school budgets will be cut by five per cent. The area administration offices will be cut from three to four and six consultant and three secretarial positions have been cut. A hiring freeze has been placed on custodial staff and a limit put on overtime. School secretaries' hours are reduced by five hours per week.
