**McHappy Day supports food bank**  
You can help the Whitchurch-Stouffville Food Bank just by dropping into McDonald's on Highway 48, north of 16th Avenue, on Saturday, May 11 and ordering a Big Mac. For each one sold, the restaurant will donate \$1 to the Whitchurch-Stouffville Food Bank.

Markham-Stouffville Hospital will have some of its state-of-the-art equipment on display and is setting up a special dolls' hospital for young visitors. The hospital is also holding a week-long food drive to assist the food bank.

Among the local celebs who will be serving at McDonald's on May 11 are Mayor Fran Sainsbury and members of council, local MP Bill Attewell, *Tribune* editor Andrew Mair and reporter Bruce Stapley, as well as members of local service clubs. Town crier Marcel Bossi will announce the start of the celebration in his splendid new uniform, donated by the town. McHappy Day gets under way at 11 p.m.

Stouffville student Stacey Betz, who suffered a broken leg and a fractured kneecap when she was hit by a car in St. Petersburg, Florida on April 18, was flown by air ambulance to Markham-Stouffville Hospital last week. Fifteen-year-old Stacey, who also sustained cuts and bruises, was very happy to be back and is expected to make a complete recovery. Travelling in the air ambulance was neat, she said.

"They phoned McDonald's from the air and when we stopped in North Carolina, they had fries waiting." Since her return "I've had tons of visitors and I've gotten lots of cookies and gifts. I'm looking forward to coming home and I'd like to thank everyone for their thoughts and prayers, and for coming to visit me." And she had a special message for her Uncle Pete, who invited her to join the family on the Florida trip. "He still owes me one nice, big holiday," she joked. Stacey hopes to be home early this week.
