Uxbridge's Ryan Harnett will be heading down to the University of Western Ontario in London to try for the Team Ontario hockey club at the end of this month.

Harnett, a 16-year-old student at Uxbridge Secondary School, was nominated by the Uxbridge Minor Hockey Association executive to attend the special preliminary under-17 tryout camp in Lindsay recently.

The camp included 68 Major Bantam players from five different centres.

ductions to the players.


Red and Orange team members were presented with special shirts for winning the championship and consolation final respectively.

Stouffville man coaches Canadian horse riding duo in Puerto Rico jumping event

The owner of a Stouffville area horse operation was chosen to coach a two-rider Canadian Junior team at a recent international jumping event in Puerto Rico.

John Pearce, the 31-year-old proprietor of Forest View Equestrian Centre on Hwy. 48 north of the Aurora Side Rd., led the duo to a

second and a fourth place finish in the 17-country competition.

The riders, Carrie Dickinson and Brynn Casselman of West Toronto, had the best showings of any competitors from countries other than the host nation.

Pearce, who won the Ontario Best

Ever Series in Show Jumping in 1990, was approached by the Canadian Equestrian Federation to coach the top-ranked Canadian junior pair.

Pearce is a horse trainer who instructs and coaches at his horse centre. He also participates in high level jumping events himself.
