Obituary

Walter Foote devoted to teaching

Walter James Foote, a well-known Whitchurch Township resident, passed away suddenly May 3.

Walter was born on the 6th Conc. and started his education at Hillcrest Public School after which he attended Stouffville Continuation School, Markham District High School and the Toronto Normal School for teacher's training.

He later graduated with a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Toronto.

Following graduation, he began teaching in rural schools in the Stouffville area, after which he was engaged by the North York Board of Education as a principal in that area.

After devoting 35 years to the teaching profession, he retired to farm "the home place" where he was born.

When he began to feel the influence of urbanization of York Region, he retreated to a farm in Victoria County and finally retired to Lindsay in 1985.

He was predeceased by his wife Hazel Waits, his sister Grace and his brother Joe.

He is survived by his second wife Myrtle Gastick of Lindsay, his son W. James (Jamie) and his wife Shirley, his daughter Mary Elizabeth, his grandchildren Julie and her husband Greg, Peter and Jan as well as one great-grandchild, Kaylea, all of the Listowel area.

He is also survived by his sister Mildred Wideman of Birchcliff and his brother Sam, who lives in Aurora.

He will be remembered by his family as well as many friends, associates and students.
