

# Schools strut their education specialties

A tour of Stouffville area schools, organized by the Whitchurch-Stouffville Education Week Committee, provided a fascinating overview of how local schools are meeting the challenges of education in the 1990s.

The event got under way at Parkview Village on Wednesday, May 8, with an announcement by town crier Marcel Bossi and an opening speech by Mayor

Fran Sainsbury. The first stop on the tour was Orchard Park where Grade 6 students performed a selection of Mexican songs and dances and introduced their colorful exhibition on Mexico.

Summitview principal Doug Winger showed plans for the new addition at the school and students displayed their computer skills for the tour group. Stouffville District Secondary School students welcomed visitors and took them through their impressive technical department.

The group then visited Dickson Hill's publishing house, and were shown samples of finished books created by students.

At Whitchurch-Highlands, the only school in York Region built on a circular plan, students served tour members a delicious lunch, preceded by a musical presentation featuring grades five and six.

The visitors were then taken through the open plan classrooms, a key feature of the building which was constructed in 1968. Students at Ballantrae Public School presented Science Quest '91, an event they have been working on for the past six weeks.

This co-operative venture enabled primary students to experience science in action through a variety of hands-on activities planned by students in grades four to six. Topics for investigation included amazing dirt, properties of matter and thumbs up for the environment.

Ballantrae was the final stop on the tour, and students offered visitors refreshments and presented them with carnations as they left.

The Education Week Committee is headed by Dorothy Good of Whitchurch-Highlands Public School, ably assisted by Anne Williamson from Stouffville District Secondary School.
