helping the hospice and its volunteers to meet increasing demands for service.

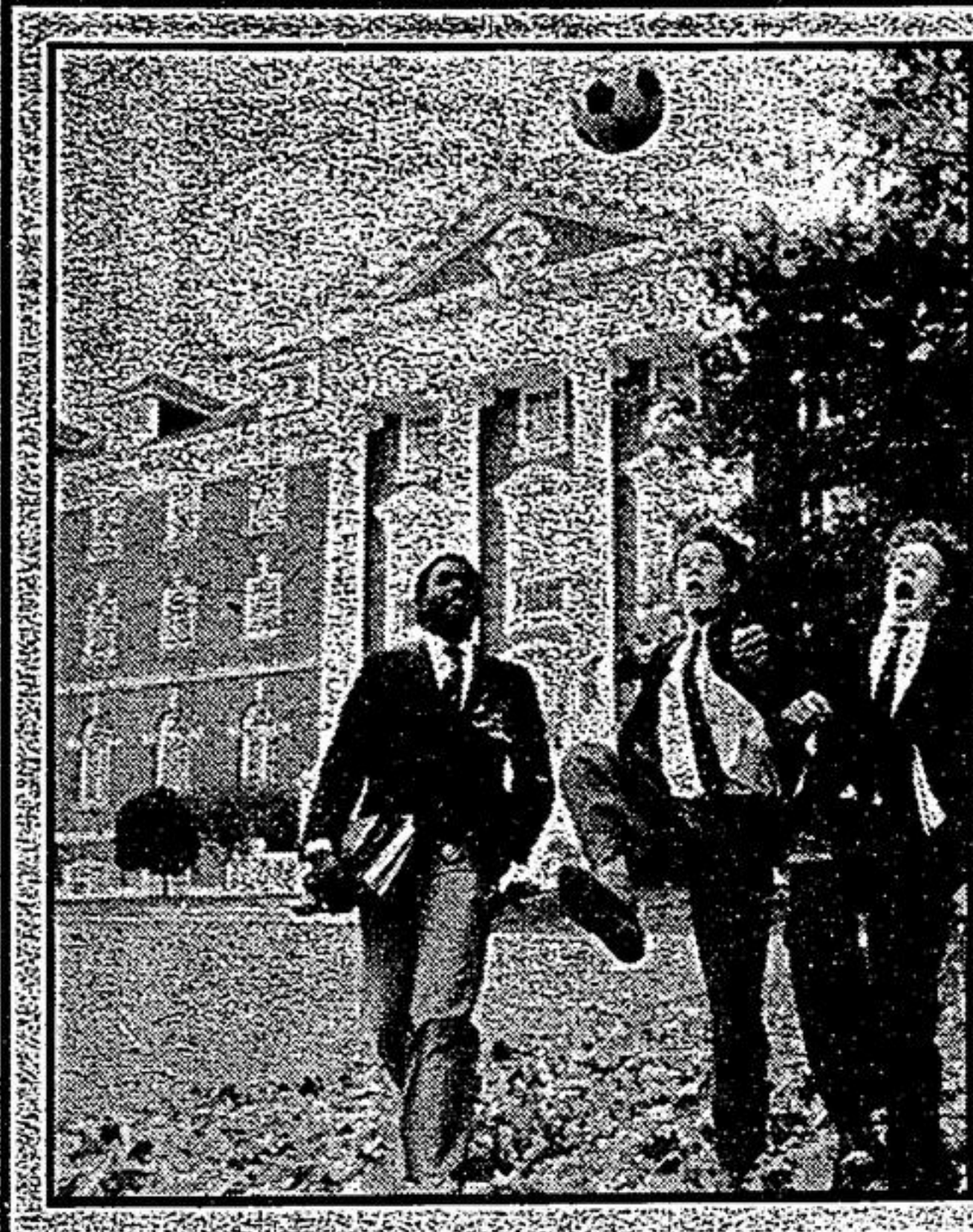
