

Child care information available

Information about licensed nursery schools in York Region is now just a toll-free call away. On Aug. 1 the Child Care Support Line (1-800-463-6663) began operation. The number allows parents to access information about licensed child care, nursery and private schools. So many people are moving in to York Region, they didn't know where to access (child care) infor-

mation or where to call, said Pam Reed, the Community Services Council's Children Services Coordinator. The line is funded by Health and Welfare Canada's Child Care Initiatives Fund and sponsored by Community Services Council of York Region. With a computerized data base at their disposal, project organizers make a wealth of information available to parents.

By dialing the number between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., callers can find out about the services available in their municipality, fees are for each program and registration details. The service will be available throughout the year. Child care centers, nursery schools and private schools listed will be contacted on a regular basis to ensure information is accurate, reliable and up-to-date.

HELP US FIND A NEW LANDFILL SITE

On April 2, 1991, The Honourable Ruth Grier, Minister of the Environment, made a policy announcement concerning the disposal of waste produced in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) which affects you. Your garbage is currently disposed of in the Brock West site where capacity is rapidly running out. That's why the Interim Waste Authority Ltd. (IWA), formed by the provincial government, is undertaking a planning process to locate a new landfill site within Durham Region.

The IWA needs your suggestions about how to find an environmentally suitable landfill site to serve your community and the residents of Durham Region.

Public open houses will soon be held in your area to help you learn more about the search process and to get your suggestions.

The Draft Approach and Criteria document fully outlines how the IWA proposes to conduct the search for a new landfill site. This document is subject to a 60-day public review period.

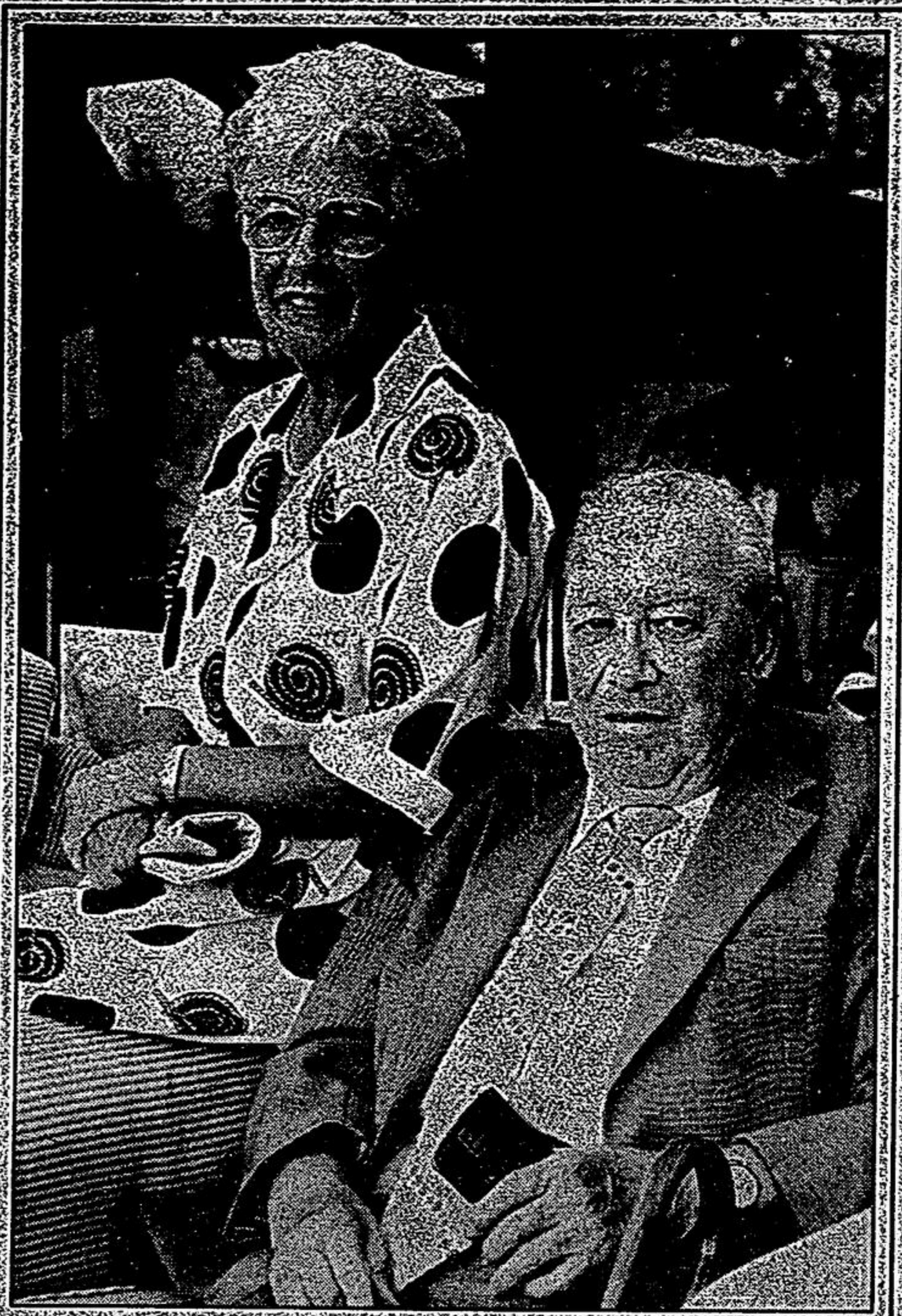
