SDSS senior Spartans volleyball champs

Four in a row.

But who's counting.

The Stouffville District Secondary School Spartans senior boys volleyball team played "good, not great volleyball" according to coach Jim Fletcher in claiming their fourth straight Durham-York (DYSSAA) title in an all-day championship tournament held in the SDSS gym Wednesday.

And while an overflow crowd of zealous SDSS fans exploded with every Spartans point scored in the final two-game sweep against Oshawa's GL Roberts CI, Spartans coach Jim Fletcher saw the event as being a long way from classic.

"We did what we had to do," said Fletcher, trying to hide his disdain for the Roberts squad's constant questioning of the game official's judgement in the title set.

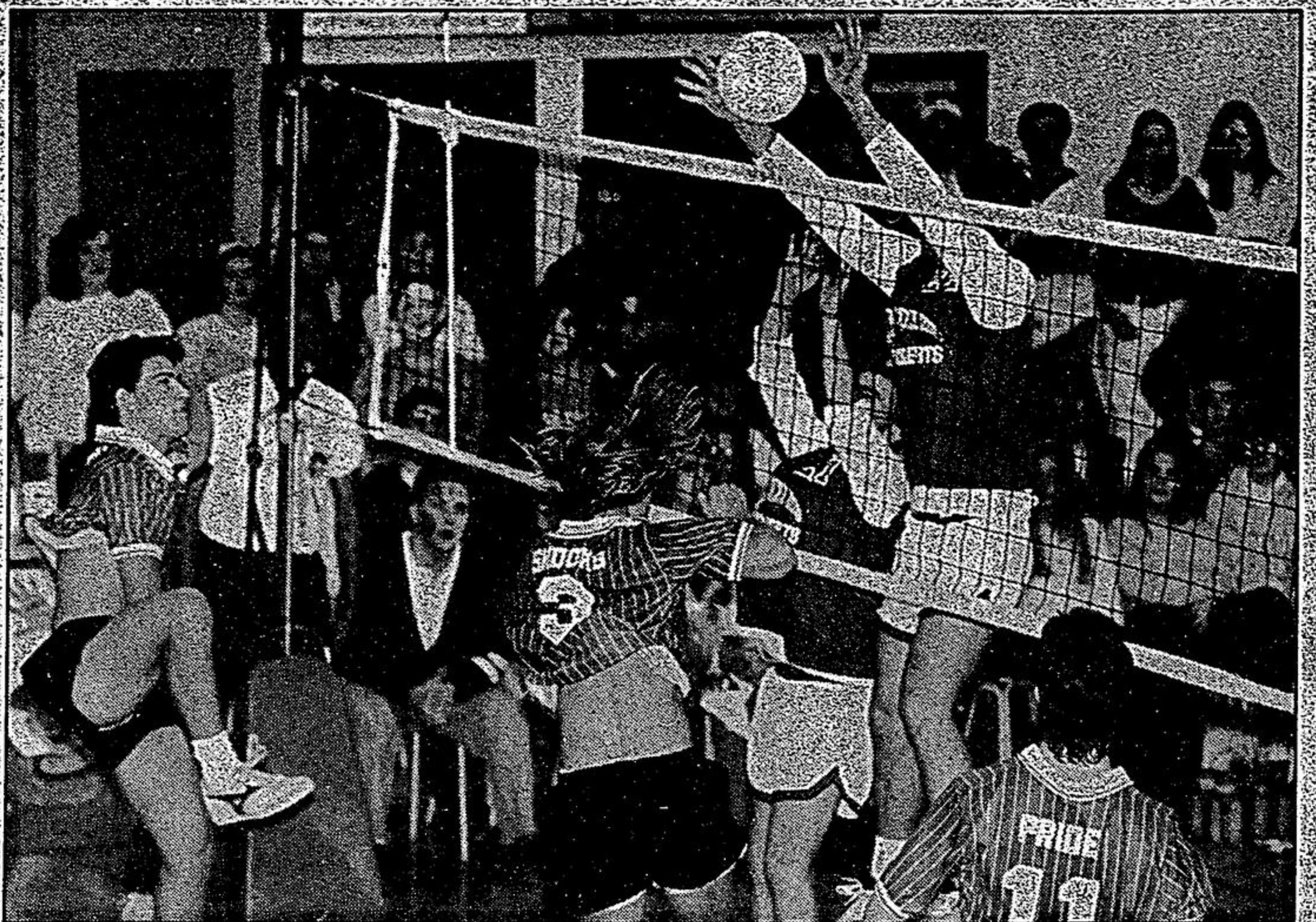
"We played good, not great, volleyball. We didn't try anything fancy. We established our hitting game in the first game, then tipped them in the second, hitting when we had to."

Great volleyball or not, the Spartans were challenged by a determined Roberts crew in the final, with SDSS winning 15-5, 15-10.

The triumph earned the Spartans yet another crack at the All-Ontario (OFSAA) championship which they will contest at Niagara Falls Stamford Collegiate next weekend.

The Spartans downed Courtice SS 15-8, 15-7 in their preliminary opener, then swept Richmond Hill HS 15-5, 15-12.

The victories gave them first place in the A pool. The Spartans disposed of Sutton HS 15-5, 15-5 in the semi-finals, despite Fletcher's compliment that the Lake

Simcoe crew played "the best I've ever seen them play."

The SDSS squad used their superior discipline and schooling in the game to overcome Roberts in the first game of the final.

Roberts came back in game two, matching the Spartans blast for blast and narrowing the SDSS lead to 11-10 at one point, before succumbing to their opponent's final assault.

Jason Cowan ended it all by

feathering a soft shot just short of the Roberts side of the net.

"It felt great," said Cowan of his clincher. "I knew it was there, I knew it was over."

The Spartans also got impressive performances from Vince Wilson, Jon Barnes, Brian Leoni, Les Hartai, Derek Sheahan and Brian Snooks.

SDSS principal Alan Dickson led off the medals presentation by acknowledging the excitement of the main event.

"As fans, we were all winners because we were treated to some excellent volleyball," said Dickson.

The Spartans will tune up for the provincial showdown by hosting a star studded Sir Wilfrid Laurier (Toronto) team in an exhibition encounter at the SDSS gym Monday afternoon at 2 p.m.

Then it's off to the Falls as the Spartans try once again to capture the elusive AA high school crown.

Junior boys take first ever DYSSAA crown

The Stouffville District Secondary School Spartans junior boys volleyball team would seem to have assured the continuing dynasty status of the school's volleyball program.

The juniors, who finished in second place in the York Region high school finals, went all the way at the Durham-York (DYSSAA) championships at Sutton HS last week. It was the first ever DYSSAA crown for an SDSS junior team.

While the Spartans were looking to serve up some revenge to the
