

Atom Clippers win Uxbridge tourney

Brett Jennings scored from Mark Meyer to give the Boyd's Sports Atom Clippers a come-from-behind 3-2 win over King City in the championship game of the Uxbridge Atom Tournament recently.

The win gave the Clippers a three-game sweep en route to the tourney title, as they downed Markham 4-0 and topped the host squad 4-2 in earlier contests.

Kyle Harrison had a pair of goals for the Boyd's bunch in the final against King City, as the Clippers fought back from a 2-0 deficit.

Brad Johnson had two assists for Stouffville.

Jason Fontana, PJ Mabley,

Brett Jennings, and Chad Kerwill had the Clippers' goals in the shutout over Markham, as Andrew Harper was flawless in goal.

In the contest with Uxbridge, it was Jennings tallying twice, with singles going to Johnson and Harrison.

Harper was solid throughout the tourney, as were Clipper defencemen Mike Wood, Chris Howland, Ryan Hause, Kerwill and Ian Andreson.

The Clippers split their four games played at the 100 team Peterborough Atom Tournament last weekend.

Harrison, Jennings, Justin Kerwill, Mark Meyer, and Brett Boyd scored to give Stouffville a

5-1 win over league rival Cobourg in game one.

Stouffville then dropped a 4-2 decision to a team from Montreal, with Jennings and Harrison scoring for the Clippers.

Harrison and Johnson clicked as the Boyd's bunch edged Ernestown 2-1.

The Clippers were eliminated when they fell 2-1 to a powerful Pembroke unit. Jennings collected the lone Stouffville goal and Harper was brilliant in net, stopping five breakaways.

Assists in the tournament were earned by Fontana, Boyd, Mabley, Jennings, Wood, Chad Kerwill, Meyer, Johnson and Hause.

Minor Atoms win playoff encounter

Richard Cho netted a pair of goals, and Brad Miller was almost unbeatable between the pipes, as the Choko Design Minor Atom Clippers skated to a 3-1 victory over Pickering in playoff round robin action at the rec centre Saturday.

The Stouffville crew fell behind 1-0 early in the first period, with Miller preventing the visitors from opening up a bigger lead.

But the Clippers found the range in the final stanza, with Cho clicking twice to put his team in front and Tyler Markle connecting with the insurance marker.

Tyler, Cho and linemate Joseph Lombardo earned assists, as the trio engineered the Clippers' comeback

drive. The Choko squad had split their two games played at a tournament in Uxbridge two weekends previous.

They downed the host team 3-1 in their opener, with Tyler Armstrong, Jesse Wood and Markle scoring.

Wood and Sean Barton had assists. The Clippers then fell 6-2 to Pickering in game two. Barton and Markle had the Choko goals, with Wood (2), and Barton assisting.

The Clippers continue their playoff set this week.

Pee Wee Clippers edged in tourney final

The Clippers had started off the week with a 4-2 exhibition game

win over Newmarket. Jeff Hassard, Lucas Anderson, Smart and Osborne clicked for the winners. Assists were earned by King (2) and Spytz.

Friday at home, the Clippers came back from a 3-1 deficit to down Oshawa 4-3.

Craig Wood and Tardella each had a goal and an assists, with King and Spytz also scoring.

Other assists went to Jeff Hassard, King and Assinck.

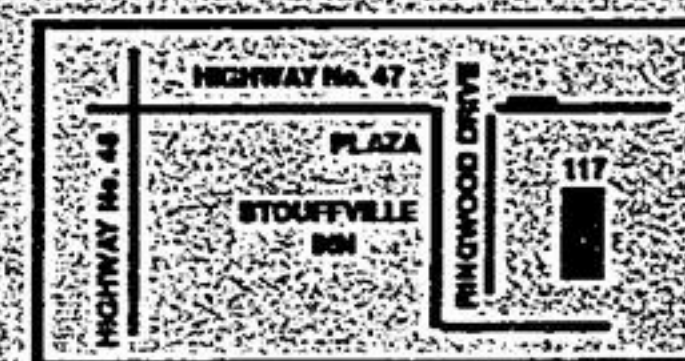
