

'Can we park here?' Music Mania organizers ask town

Music Mania organizers want to store a 48-foot trailer on public lands, but officials aren't sure they can accommodate the group.

Bob Lewis asked council permission Tuesday to park a Music Mania prop and equipment trailer close to town with year-round accessibility.

The organization would need a 500-square-foot space, he said.

Council asked organizers if they had checked out any other areas in town, but Music Mania

producer Doris Harvey said since the music show has raised \$41,500 during the last 32 years, "council would be glad to accommodate us."

However, works director Paul Whitehouse said both the Vandorf and the Stouffville work yards have limited space and the local Transportation Ministry yard is also "very tight."

And building director Bob Bennett told officials that even if someone donated a portion of their rural lands to park the trailer, it was illegal for com-

mercial vehicles to be stored on farmland.

Council will discuss the matter and come up with sugges-

tions over the next few weeks, it was decided.
