Stouffville won't know if it will be the site of a new Junior B franchise until after June 20 according to Ontario Hockey Association (OHA) president Brent Ladds.

Ladds told the Tribune Wednesday that the Central Junior B Hockey League, the league Stouffville has applied for, was to address the application before the OHA's annual meeting, June 20.

The application would be decided upon during or just after the OHA meeting, said Ladds.

"It's standard procedure for us to make a decision regarding an application before the season preceding the bid is made for," said Ladds.

The Stouffville interests have applied for entry into the Central League for the 1993-94 season.
