There'll be action and entertainment galore in Stouffville's downtown on Strawberry Festival weekend.

The fun starts Friday evening with Moonlight Madness, orga-

nized by Downtown Stouffville. Stores will be offering festival specials and promotions, and will welcome friends and neighbors to their community get-together which runs until 10 p.m. If you love to bake, Saturday's strawberry pie and jam contest, sponsored by the BIA,

is your chance to shine, while those with steady hands and an eagle eye can try their luck in the Earl of Whitchurch's darts contest.

Fed up with your freckles? Make them work for you by entering the freckle contest sponsored by who else? - Freckles. Entertainment gets under way Saturday at 10 a.m. on the town stage with a demonstration from Stouffville Fitness Resort.

Shades of Blue, performing from 11 a.m., features four members of York Region's finest, recreating some of the best music from the '50s and '60s. The four piece band, consisting of guitarist, bass player, keyboardist and drummer,

donates its services free of charge to charitable events and schools. Last year, Shades of Blue performed in a total of 46 shows. Drummer Frank Gliona is a Stouffville resident.

Members of the Music Mania chorus will weave some of their musical magic at noon.

Activities kick off on Thursday, June 25 with the Lion's Barbecue and a lawn bowling tournament. On Friday, the Silver Jubilee Club is hosting a euchre tournament in the afternoon, and everyone is invited to come out to the third annual Sacred Music Concert, which takes place Friday evening at Parkview Auditorium.

Strolling down Main Street and browsing through the craft tables or checking out festival specials at local stores are pleasant ways to spend Saturday. You can get the day off to a good start with a hearty pancake breakfast, hosted by the Ballantrae Lions. And if you've got a favorite pie or jam recipe, now's your opportunity to enter it in one of the festival competitions.

The community church service in the park is always a highlight of the weekend, and it will be followed again this year by the perennially popular strawberry social. The grand finale takes place Wednesday, July 1, Canada's 125th birthday, with lots of entertainment and music, topped off by a spectacular display of fireworks in the park.
