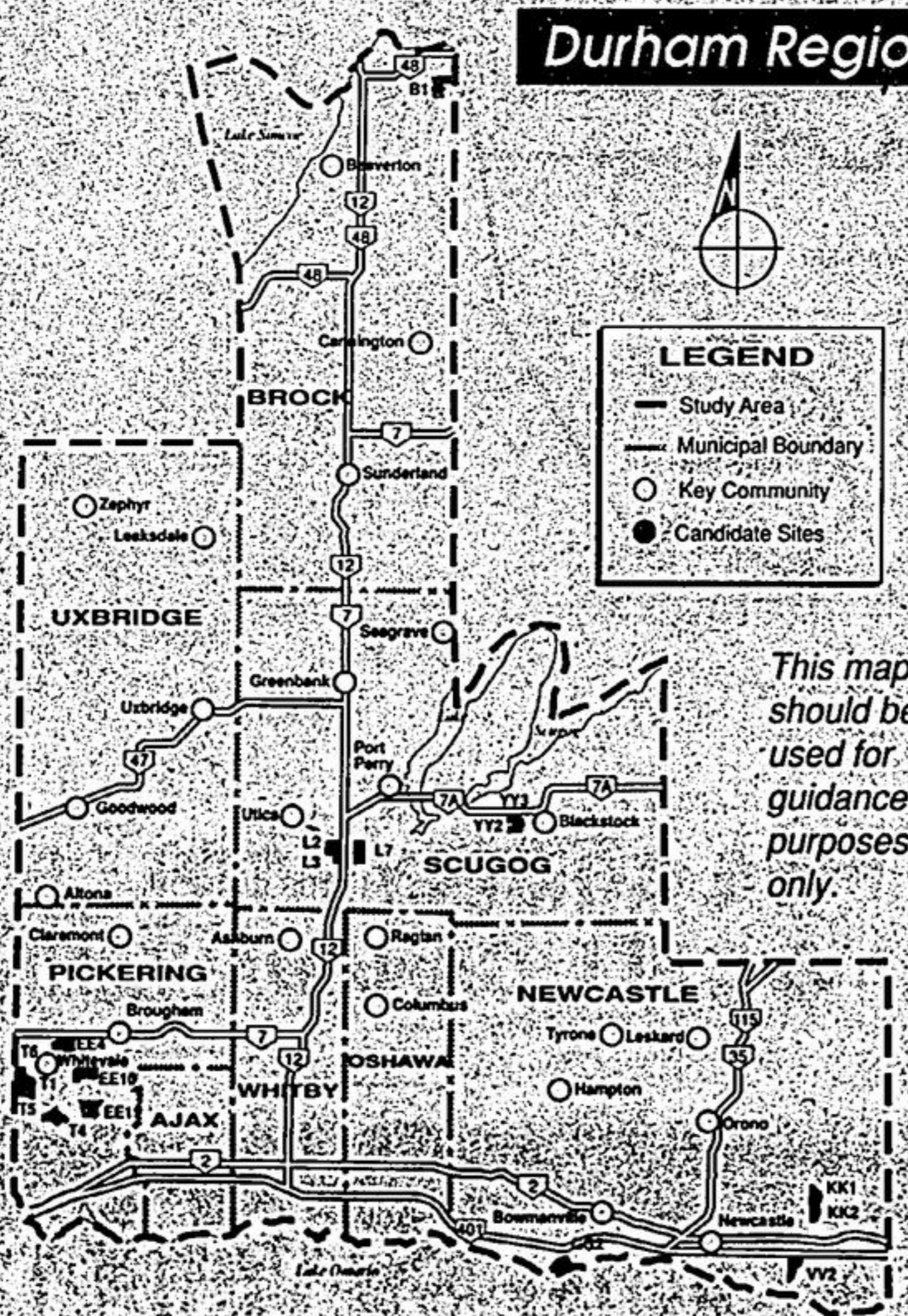

POSSIBLE LANDFILL SITES



The Interim Waste Authority, a Crown corporation, has identified a list of candidate landfill sites to meet the long-term waste disposal needs of the Region of Durham. These sites, shown here, have been selected because of environmental considerations.

Any one of these sites may be suitable for a landfill site. However, after more detailed technical investigations, a **short list** of four to six sites will be selected for further study, and finally **one** preferred site will be selected in Durham Region.

Public input is essential throughout the site selection process. Landowners, tenants and residents on or close to the possible sites have already received information. The IWA will be holding workshops in your area to discuss the ranking and the methodology that will be used to go from the long list to the short list, and finally to a preferred site.

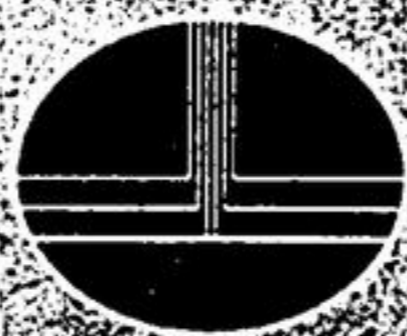
