SUBJECT PROPERTY
 The subject property is shown outlined as the Gormley Industrial Plan (1992) on the plan below.

EXPLANATORY NOTE
 The proposed Amendment (the "Amendment") being the Gormley Industrial Plan (1992), would change the land use designations on the subject property in the Official Plan from Rural to Industrial. Other changes in the land use designations will be made in accordance with the Gormley Industrial Plan (1992).

The proposed Amendment will include policies to govern and control development within the Gormley Industrial Plan area.
