AUGUST

The Stouffville area had three participants in the Olympic Games in Barcelona, with all three being involved in equestrian events. Tom Gayford was coach of the Canadian jumping team, and Martina Pracht was a member of the national dressage team. Gwen Rooks was chef d'equipe for the dressage team.

Former Stouffville resident Scott Evans pitched his Lloydminster, Alberta team to the title at the Canadian Junior Men's Fastball Championships in Richmond, B.C.

Chris Burkholder, of the Stouffville Merchants, starred for the Ontario representative St. Catharines A's after being picked up by the A's for the national competition.

In hardball, the Stouffville Pee Wee Indians were stopped by Parry Sound in the zone finals.

The Kellington Gardens Squirt girls' softball team captured its league playoff title, and then added a provincial bronze medal in its first year as a team.

The Stouffville State Farms Squirts rolled to victory at the OASA championship tournament in Joyceville Aug. 28-29. It was the fourth consecutive provincial crown for the Squirts.

In soccer, Vicki Devenport, the wife of Stouffville Town Spurs goalkeeper Ross, tended goal for the Spurs in a game against the Newmarket Mayans. It was the first time a woman had ever played in a Newmarket and District Soccer League contest.

SEPTEMBER

The Stouffville Legion Mites came within an extra-inning heartbreaking loss of winning their fourth straight OASA title at the provincial championship tournament played over the Labour Day weekend.

World class show jumping came to Whitchurch-Stouffville

Sept. 27, as the Eglington Equestrian Club hosted the Mercedes Benz World Cup Qualifier. Schomberg's Jay Hayes won the event, which included several riders from the Canadian Olympic jumping team.

OCTOBER

The SDSS Midget boys' cross country team captured the gold for the second year in a row at the Durham-York (DYSSAA) high school championships Oct. 28. The SDSS team was 16th out of 36 teams at the OFSAA finals in November.

The school's Pia Uhl and Tim Lavell took the silver medal at the DYSSAA mixed doubles tennis championships Oct. 21.

NOVEMBER

The town's Angie's Pee Wees and Action Signs Bantams both reigned victorious at the tournament they co-hosted at the Rec Centre Nov. 15.

The SDSS Senior boys' Spartans volleyball team took its sixth straight DYSSAA crown, then after a slow start captured the Consolation championship at the OFSAA title tournament in Alliston.

DECEMBER

The Action Signs Bantam girls skated to another tournament victory in Orangeville Dec. 13.

The Dickson Hill P.S. Intermediate girls volleyball team bumped its way to victory in the Area F finals, then placed second at the York Region championships Dec. 15.

Ed Hakonson announced he had been given approval by the OHA to set up a Junior B hockey team for Stouffville, but said he probably wouldn't be interested due to the length of time it had taken the OHA to make its decision. He said Don Anderson's earlier decision to withdraw his support, and that of the Kingston Frontenacs, had influenced his own thinking.

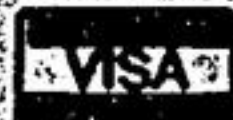

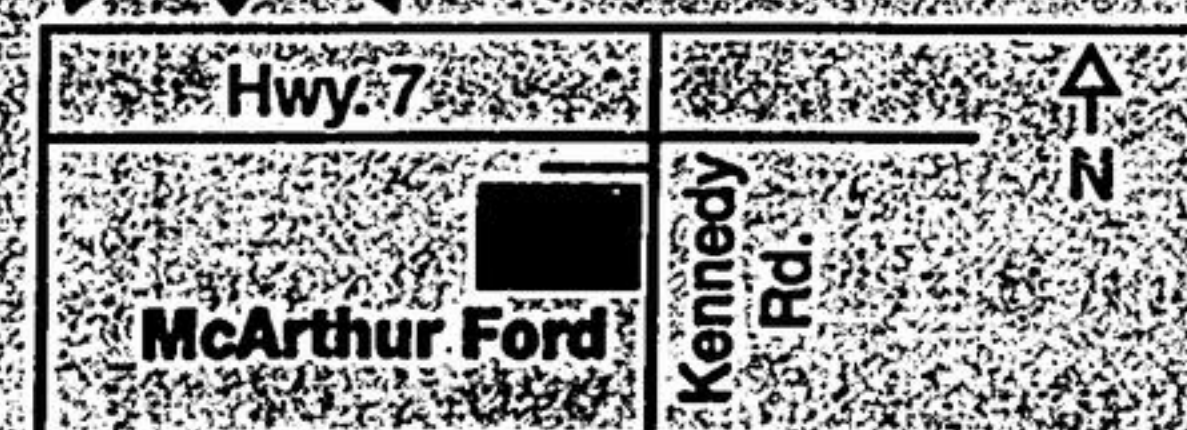
