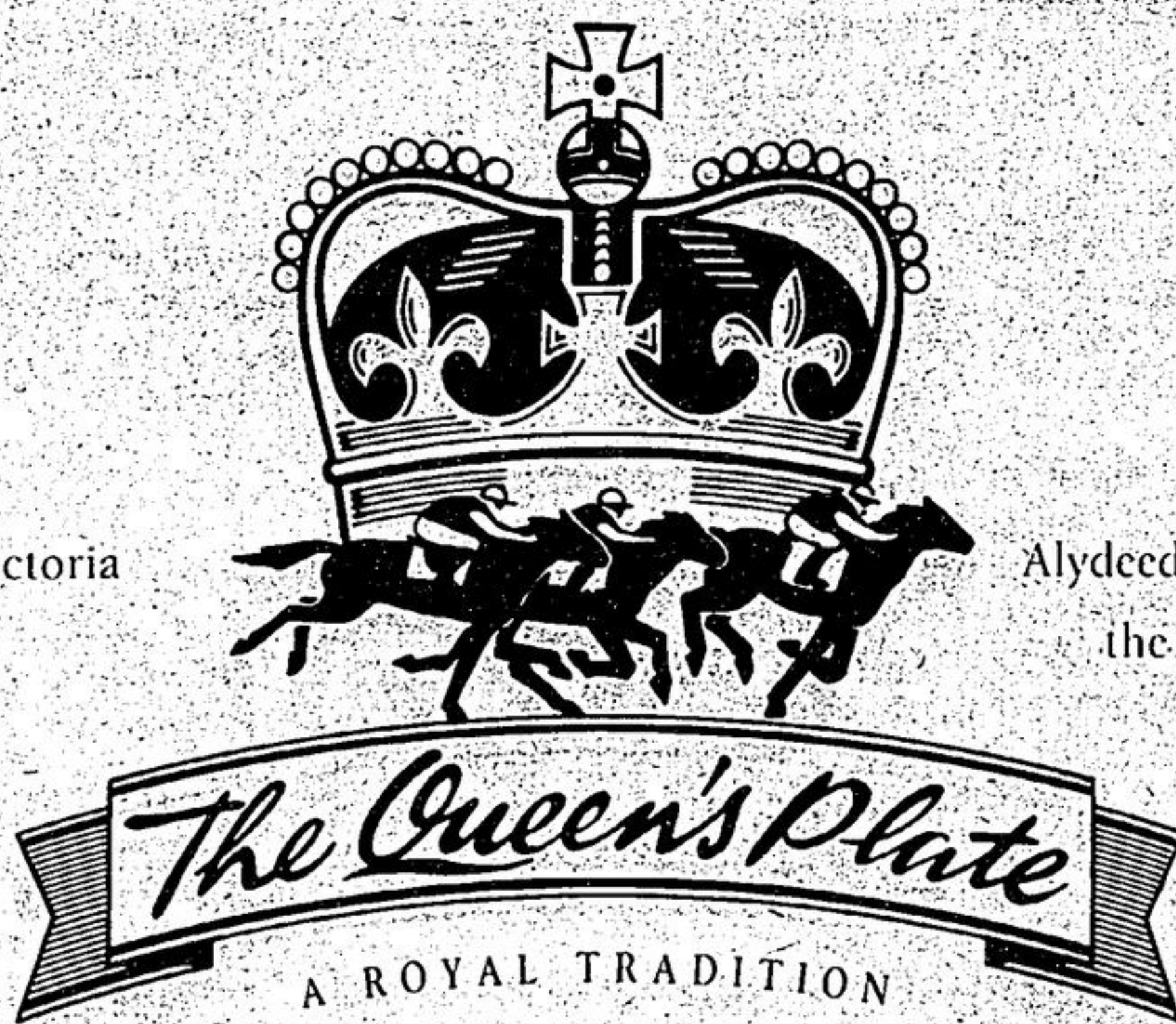


Whatever COLOUR it is,
