Shawn Sargeant, Norm Davis and Tim Smart each had two hits to key the win. Evan Boyd, Scott Assinck, and Mike Underwood had a hit apiece.

The win left Stouffville tied with Napanee and

Bramalea. But it was Napanee advancing to the tournament final on a tie breaker technicality involving runs scored against the same opponents.

In the tournament opener, Koert was flawless in blanking Newmarket 9-0. Sargeant had two hits to lead the offence.

Stouffville suffered a 6-2 loss to Bramalea in their second game.

In recent league play, the Myers outfit suffered its first regular season loss of the year, a 4-3 setback at the hands of Aurora. Pitcher Kris VanKoughnet had a no hitter through 4 2/3 innings before Aurora rallied.
